## NEW HOMEOWNERS NEEDING AMENITY CARDS

*Welcome to Riverstone!* To have amenity cards made for you, please email us the following:

1. Completed amenity card form (found at [www.rshoa.org](http://www.rshoa.org))
2. Deed or closing disclosure

3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.

4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18

5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

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# YOUR RIVERSTONE HOA

## Have You Received Your Annual Assessment?

*The annual Riverstone HOA assessments have been mailed to owners.* If you have not received your assessment statement, please contact the Association Office at 281.778.2222. You can also view your account and assessment information on our Resident Account Portal ([www.rshoa.org](http://www.rshoa.org)). Assessment Payments are due January 1, 2022 and are considered delinquent after January 31, 2022. A bro-

chure with payment options and instructions was included in your statement, and information is available on our website. Please note that payments are posted to your account on the date received, NOT the postmarked date. Please be sure to pay your assessments on time to avoid payment plan fees, late fees, and/or interest. Please email [finance@rshoa.org](mailto:finance@rshoa.org) with any questions.

## ASSESSMENT FAQs

### Do I need to create an account to pay online?

- Yes. You must be logged in to our Resident Account Portal to make your online payment.

### Is there a fee to pay online?

- It depends. There is no fee to pay by eCheck. If you pay by credit card, there is a 3% convenience fee. If paying by debit card, there is a \$5.00 fee.

### Can I mail a check?

### Where do I find my Management Co ID, Association ID, and User Account Number?

- The Management Co ID is 7214.

### Are there payment plan options?

## Calling All Volunteers!

***Annually, the Riverstone HOA Board appoints resident volunteers as members on various committees that have been created specifically geared towards different areas of interest.*** A few current committees include the Hearing Advisory Committee, the Landscaping Committee, and the Architectural Review Committee.

**Architectural Review Committee**—This committee is responsible for reviewing applications related to modifications of residential properties and will help develop policies/guidelines for the community.

**Hearing Advisory Committee**—This committee is responsible for determining if fines or other penalties should be imposed for violations of the Associations' respective dedicatory instruments. This committee shall meet monthly or as needed, and will be comprised of at least 5, but no more than 7 members.

**Landscape Committee**—Residents serving on this committee shall assist in identifying landscaping related projects, as needed. They shall coordinate yard of the month and annual holiday decorating contest, as well as, help HOA staff identify areas which may not accurately reflect the pride of this community (i.e., littering) and work with HOA staff to brainstorm and implement ideas that promote taking pride in our community. This committee shall meet bimonthly or as needed.

# COMPLIANCE REMINDERS & TIPS

## Property Maintenance

### Power/Pressure Washing Sidewalk or Driveway

Why is it important to power wash your sidewalk and/or driveway? Over time sidewalks and driveways collect dirt and allow mold and mildew to start growing on the concrete. When this happens and if it continues without intervention, the area may become slippery and could potentially create a hazard. It also detracts from the look of our community when dirt, stains, and mildew are easily visible from the street. This can also be true near and around pop-up drains from pools or French drains that are close to the curb. Power/Pressure



washing the sidewalk and driveway areas of your property, this includes the sidewalk in front of your property and on the side if it is a corner lot, will help to maintain the look of our community.

### Trash/Recycle Bins

Trash and Recycle bins that are left out in public view on non-trash days is one of the top violations that the Compliance department sees throughout our community. To help keep our community looking its best we want to remind all residents to remove their trash/recycle bins from public view on non-trash days. This can be achieved by placing the bins in the garage or behind a wooden fence. You may also submit an ARC application to install a storage area for the Trash and Recycle bins and have it reviewed by our ARC committee. ### Lawn Bags

Lawn clippings that are left in bags at the curb or end of the driveway are also considered a violation of the deed restrictions. All trash, including the lawn clippings, must be placed in an appropriate container and stored out of view on non-trash days. This will help to keep our neighborhoods looking tidy.

## Apply Before You Modify!

**Did Santa bring a new basketball goal or outdoor playset?** Or are you wanting to make an addition to your house or build a new shed or fence in your back yard? Before you break out the miter saw, make sure to get your plans approved by Riverstone Homeowner Association's Architectural Review Committee.

While it may seem arbitrary from an individual homeowner's standpoint, the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) looks out for the entire community. Aside from stopping residents from painting pink polka dots on their houses, the committee's job is to make sure that the size and style of the project, the type of building materials being used, and the overall look of the new structure adhere to the Association's design requirements. Not only does this keep the community looking cohesive, it also helps to keep property values up by prevent-

ing individual structures from standing out. It's also important to note that unapproved modifications might legally have to be removed at the owner's expense, so save yourself money and headaches by getting approval first!

## HOA Reserve Funds 101

### *How Do HOA Reserve Funds Differ from Operating Funds?*

The HOA operating fund is used to finance the daily expenses of the HOA. This includes payment for maintenance of common areas, fitness and pool management services, legal and office expenses, insurance premiums, and more. The reserve fund, on the other hand, is used for large-scale projects and improvements that are expected to happen in the future.

When it comes to HOA reserve funds, the association documents are particularly strict about how these funds will be spent. Any spending must adhere to the community's rules and regulations as well as accountability and bylaws. Think of reserve funds as the money used to pay for expenses that do not occur on a regular basis. That can include major landscaping enhancements, replacement of aging fitness equipment, resurfacing of community pools, and replacement of deteriorating brick fence.

These larger-scale projects are significantly more expensive than the usual daily operating costs of the community. Having a well-funded reserve account allows the Association to cover these expenses without having to raise association dues or resorting to special assessments.

Additionally, having sufficient money in the HOA reserve funds allows the Association to account for unexpected expenses. For example, the clubhouse may experience damage due to hurricanes and tropical storms. The reserve fund provides the Association the ability to address repairs in a timely manner without burdening the homeowners with additional costs.

### *How Much Money Should Be in the HOA Reserve Fund?*

To properly determine the value of all Association assets and set an appropriate reserve funding level, the Riverstone HOA hires a professional reserve study provider to conduct a reserve study for our association every 3 to 5 years.

A reserve study is a complex document that projects when numerous major components—like the roof, parking lot or tennis court—will need to be replaced, what they will cost and how much we need to set aside each year to pay for the various components at the necessary time. Preparing it requires a unique combination of specialized engineering knowledge, a keen understanding of financial projecting and savvy investing skills.

Professional reserve study providers are extensively trained before they are considered qualified to perform competent reserve studies tailored for each community. These professionals have met stringent requirements and are held to high standards. They have a thorough knowledge of HOA communities and can provide the Association with sound guidance.

HOA reserve funds are important for the maintenance and improvement of any community. As such, it is the responsibility of the Association to ensure that they have an adequate reserve fund. The money in this fund is crucial to implement repairs and replacements that normally happen over time, as well as those that happen unexpectedly.

## Fitness Programming Expands in 2022!

*Health, fitness, and overall wellbeing have become growing elements of everyone's life.* With that in mind, we are excited to share that beginning this month the fitness team will start adding additional programming for residents to enjoy. This will not only include fitness classes and challenges, but will also feature specialty events throughout the year including a community 5K.

Beginning the week of January 16th, the Riverstone Fitness Team will offer **three complimentary fitness classes**. As we continue to evaluate the classes and certain classes become more popular, additional classes may be added with a nominal fee charged.

### Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

### Unauthorized Tennis Lessons

Recently there has been an increase of tennis lessons at Riverstone by unauthorized tennis pros. Please keep in mind that HOA rules prohibits the teaching of tennis lessons by unauthorized persons.

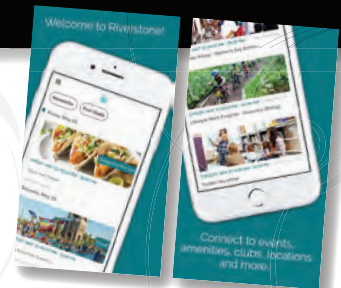
