NEW HOMEOWNERS NEEDING AMENITY CARDS

Welcome to Riverstone! To have amenity cards made for you, please email us the following:

1. Completed amenity card form (found at www.riverstone.com)
2. Deed or closing disclosure

3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.
4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.
5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

REPLACING A LOST AMENITY CARD

The replacement of lost Amenity Cards is available for \$15 each.

If you need a replacement Amenity Card, please complete the credit card form found on our website (www.riverstone.com) and email it to us at customercare@riverstone.com. Please also include your home address and a headshot picture labeled with your name and date of birth.

Calling All Volunteers!

Annually, the Riverstone HOA Board appoints resident volunteers as members on various committees that have been created specifically geared towards different areas of interest. A few current committees include the Hearing Advisory Committee, the Landscaping Committee, the Gated Neighborhood Committees and the Architectural Review Committee.

Architectural Review Committee—Responsible for approving or disapproving applications made to it for proposed alterations, additions or changes to be made to the exterior of homes and/or any portion of the Lot itself.

Hearing Advisory Committee—Responsible for holding hearings for members of the Associations to determine if fines or other penalties should be imposed for violations of the Associations' respective dedicatory instruments.

Landscape Committee—Assists in beautification of the community by identifying needed landscaping related projects and priority areas. Coordinates yard of the month and the annual home holiday decorating contest. Helps identify areas which may not ac-

curately reflect the pride of the community (i.e. littering) and works with staff to brainstorm ideas that promote taking pride in our community.

Gated Neighborhood Committee(s)—Responsible for recommending service levels and providing input on reserve projects for their respective Gated Neighborhood (such as gate operations, landscaping, camera systems, etc.). They also provide input on annual Gated Neighborhood Assessment levels and annual budgets.

Have You Received Your Annual Assessment?

The annual Riverstone HOA assessments have been mailed to owners. If you have not received your assessment statement, please contact the Association Office at 281.778.2222. You can also view your account and assessment information on our Resident Account Portal (www.rshoa.org). Assessment Payments are due January 1, 2023 and are considered delinquent after January 31, 2023. A brochure with payment options and instructions was included in your statement, and information is available on our website. Please note that payments are posted to your account on the date received, NOT the postmarked date. Please be sure to pay your assessments on time to avoid payment plan fees, late fees, and/or interest. Please email finance@riverstone.com with questions.

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ASSESSMENT FAQs

Do I need to create an account to pay online?

- Yes. You must be logged in to our Resident Account Portal to make your online payment.

Is there a fee to pay online?

- It depends. There is no fee to pay by eCheck. If you pay by credit card, there is a 3% convenience fee. If paying by debit card, there is a \$5.00 fee.

Can I mail a check?

Where do I find my Management Co ID, Association ID, and User Account Number?

- The Management Co ID is 7214.
- The Association ID is R100.

- Absolutely! Residents can opt for a 3-to-6-month payment plan without accruing Interest Charges or Late Fees. There is a \$20 per month Administrative and Processing Fee. Please contact finance@riverstone.com for more information.

and can use our Evolt-360 body composition scanner to track their progress, as well."

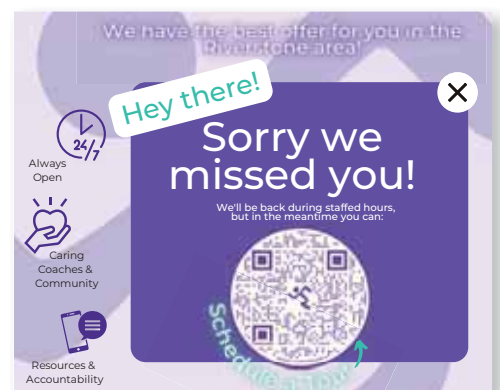

Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight

Adults are not the only people experiencing homelessness. Due to circumstances beyond their control, many disadvantaged youths find themselves couch surfing, living in cars or in motels. Many have been abandoned by family. That's when Parks Youth Ranch steps in to help.



Parks Youth Ranch (PYR) is the only non-profit emergency youth shelter in Fort Bend County. Founded in 2011, the 8-acre ranch provides emergency shelter, counseling and life changing services to abused and neglected youth ages 7 to 17 for 90 days.

"PYR partners with all Fort Bend County school districts to assist any student who needs our services," said Angela Parker Boepple, Development Officer for Parks Youth Ranch. "Last school year, 940 youth in Fort Bend ISD and 677 youth in Lamar CISD experienced homelessness."

Youth are provided with a bed, clothing, food, educational support and services via the Fred and Mable R. Parks Emergency Shelter, the George Counseling Center and the Fort Bend Junior Service League Recreation Center.

"It is our goal to support the youth in our care with all their needs—physically, emotionally and educationally as well as with normalcy activities," said Parker Boepple.

While living at the shelter, staff evaluate residents to provide an in-depth assessment of the individual challenges that keep them out of the home. They then develop a realistic plan that addresses the unique circumstances of each resident. The goal is to provide permanency, stability, safety and emotional well-being in after-care placements.

Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI)® is a key element in helping residents. It is an attachment-based, trauma-informed intervention that is designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children. Parks Youth Ranch joined forces with Child Advocates of Fort Bend, Lamar CISD, Sanctuary Foster Care Services and Fort Bend County Juvenile Probation and Fort Bend County Behavioral Health in 2021 to form the Fort Bend TBRI Collaborative.

"The collaborative was created to equip adults in Fort Bend County working in child welfare, juvenile justice, teachers and volunteers with the right tools and techniques that bring healing and hope to vulnerable children," Parker Boepple said.

While living at Parks Youth Ranch, residents attend school, are provided transportation to medical and dental providers and are referred to other agencies as appropriate. Arrangements are made to provide them with outside service providers for tutoring, life skills, psychological testing, substance abuse and behavior modification as needed.

After 90 days, residents return to a family member or go into a foster home. Beginning this year, Parks Youth Ranch is expanding program offerings to include a Transitional Living Program (TLP) to serve youth ages 15 to 20.

"Over the last few years, we have supported mostly older teens and witnessed their struggle to find resources and support as they face the transition to adulthood," Parker Boepple said. "The goal of the TLP is to support up to eight young men and women each year by meeting their educational, vocational and individual goals. The TLP will provide older youth with housing and stability in their lives."

Parks Youth Ranch employs 16 full-time and 12 part-time employees. More than 50 volunteers donate their time each year. PYR is always in need of donations and volunteers.

"Residents of Riverstone can help Parks Youth Ranch by donating items off of our Amazon Wish List or volunteering on one of our event committees or with the youth at the ranch," Parker Boepple said. "We welcome volunteer groups of any size to experience a day with the residents of PYR."

HISTORY

Parks Youth Ranch (PYR) started from a dream in the early 2000s and became a reality when the property in rural Fort Bend County was purchased in 2009. Since opening our doors in 2011, PYR has provided a Home for Today, Hope for Tomorrow to over 1,600 at-risk and homeless youth from across Texas. PYR remains the only non-profit emergency shelter for youth in Fort Bend County.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Unauthorized Tennis Lessons

Recently there has been an increase of tennis lessons at Riverstone by unauthorized tennis pros. Please keep in mind that HOA rules prohibits the teaching of tennis lessons by unauthorized persons.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #9 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts.
- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.
- Remember that court reservations will be forfeited after 15 minutes of not showing up for scheduled start time.
- Tennis courts are for the use of tennis or pickleball play only. Any other sports or equipment are strictly prohibited. For more information refer to rule #4 at the Resource Center under Community Info.

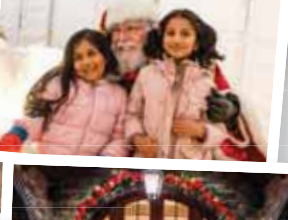
