NEW HOMEOWNERS NEEDING AMENITY CARDS

Welcome to Riverstone! To have amenity cards made for you, please email us the following:

1. Completed amenity card form (found at www.riverstone.com)
2. Deed or closing disclosure

3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.

4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.

5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

REPLACING A LOST AMENITY CARD

The replacement of lost Amenity Cards is available for \$15 each.

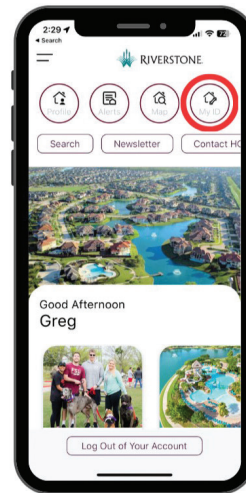
We are excited to streamline mobile access in the community with updated features to your MyID in the Riverstone app!

NEIGHBORHOOD NEWS

Compliance Reminders

Riverstone Compliance Department encourages all residents to take a few minutes and look over their property for any potential Deed Restriction issue that may result in a violation.

- **January–February**—Optimal time to replace or plant new trees and/or landscaping. Use preemergent weed control if needed. Treat for fire ants. Fertilize with slow-release product as needed.
- **March–October**—Mowing season begins. Lawns may need to be mowed every 7-to 10 days. Weed landscaping beds and expansion joints on sidewalk and driveways.
- **April–October**—Shrubs and other landscaping should be kept trimmed and shaped at all times. Landscaping and trees should be trimmed to not obstruct walkways, traffic in road, street signs, or address plaque.
- **July–October**—Treat for chinch bugs as needed. Apply fungicide as needed to control diseases.
- **November–December**—Mow, if necessary, to prevent winter annual weeds from flowering, apply post emergence herbicide for winter annuals.
- Remove any dirt and/or mildew from property, pressure wash driveways and sidewalks to remove dirt and/or stains and trim trees over sidewalk and roads.
- Trash/Recycle bins and lawn bags need to be placed out of public view on non-trash days. All trash must be placed in an appropriate trash container per the deed restrictions.

Tree Topping Information



Many people think that you can shorten a tree by cutting off the top. What they don't realize is that topping permanently disfigures and damages the tree, and may even kill it.

Once a tree is topped, it can be improved with the help of an arborist, but it can never be completely restored.

Does Topping Hurt Trees? Topping damages trees by: Removing much of the leaf surface area needed to produce food and the food storage reserves. Leaving large wounds that are slow to heal and become entry points for insects and disease organisms. Allowing strong sunlight to enter the central parts of the tree, resulting in sunscald, cracks and peeling bark.

Tree topping is considered a violation of the restrictions here in Riverstone as it is not considered the proper way to maintain trees in our area. You may also be required to replace the tree(s) that has been topped.

Sheriff's Corner

FORT BEND COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE: UNITED AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Coming off the heels of January's Human Trafficking Prevention Month, the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office stands united in the fight against one of the most heinous crimes. Human trafficking is a serious threat that affects individuals of all ages, genders, and backgrounds. It thrives in the shadows, preying on vulnerability, and tearing apart lives.

The Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office is dedicated to combating this crime through education, awareness, and proactive measures. We work tirelessly to investigate, apprehend perpetrators, and provide support to survivors.

In the year 2023, the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office Human Trafficking Unit investigated 51 cases related to human trafficking and made 41 arrests. These numbers underscore the pressing need

for continued vigilance and action against this pervasive crime.

"Prevention begins with awareness," said Fort Bend County Sheriff Eric Fagan. "Everyone can help by learning the types of trafficking and paying attention to the people around us."

Fort Bend County residents are urged to stay informed, recognize the signs of human trafficking, and report any suspicious activities to law enforcement.

Everyone needs a helping hand. When it comes to food insecurity, Rosenberg-Richmond Helping Hands is here to provide aid.

The mission of Rosenberg-Richmond Helping Hands is to feed, clothe and provide essential services to the underserved in West Fort Bend County.

“Our organization was created in 1985 by the surrounding churches who saw the need to serve those families who were struggling with food insecurities,” said Michael Gutierrez, Executive Director Rosenberg Richmond Helping Hands. “A lot of these churches still support our organization today with monetary donations and food and clothing drives.”



In 2022, the non-profit assisted 11,835 households which equates to 33,318 individuals. That number was surpassed in 2023 and will most likely rise again in 2024. The organization strives to help until the individual or family becomes self-sufficient.

Most families need food and clothing, but Rosenberg-Richmond Helping Hands also provides some financial support to help families

with rentals, hotel stays, utilities and medications. In one case, they helped a homeless client get a Social Security card and ID which allowed him to receive benefits that helped him to pay for a place to stay.



soups and fruits and cereal as well as personal care items including toothbrushes, toothpaste, bars of soap and toilet paper.



“The joy on his face when he initially received his ID was priceless because you would think that he had just won \$1 million,” Gutierrez said. “We could see that just having an ID gave him a sense of pride and ownership.”

Rosenberg-Richmond Helping Hands does not receive state or federal funding. They are constantly in need of donations such as meats, veggies, soups and fruits and cereal as well as personal care items including toothbrushes, toothpaste, bars of soap and toilet paper.

“These are the items most of us take for granted,” Gutierrez said. “These clients cannot afford to buy them at the store since their focus is often directed toward paying the rent, utility or medication.”

Rosenberg-Richmond Helping Hands also needs volunteers in their food pantry, clothing closet or as interviewers. Gutierrez said that volunteering gives people an opportunity to see how donations assist those who are struggling financially to put food on the table.

“We are here to help those that are struggling with food insecurities,” Gutierrez said. We also depend on the generosity of our local communities, churches and organizations to help us

to continue to be able to assist those that are in need. We stand by our mission and vision of ‘Hunger Stops Here’—no one should have to go to bed hungry, especially a child.”

This will avoid burnout and help it become part of your lifestyle."

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #9 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts. They are available for walk-on play during tennis court hours. Please be mindful when using the courts for walk-on play and limit your time to a maximum of 2 hours.
- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.
- Remember that court reservations will be forfeited after 15 minutes of not showing up for scheduled start time.
- Tennis courts are for the use of tennis or pickleball play only. Any other sports or equipment are strictly prohibited. For more information refer to rule #4 at the Resource Center under Community Info.
- Parking for use of Tennis Courts 9 & 10 is at the Riverstone Blvd Recreation Center. Please refrain from parking within the Parkside neighborhood.

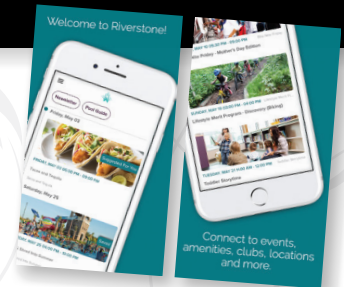
