NEW HOMEOWNERS NEEDING AMENITY CARDS

Welcome to Riverstone! To have amenity cards made for you, please email us the following:

1. Completed amenity card form (found at www.riverstone.com)
2. Deed or closing disclosure

3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.
4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.
5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

REPLACING A LOST AMENITY CARD

The replacement of lost Amenity Cards is available for \$15 each.

If you need a replacement Amenity Card, please complete the credit card form found on our website (www.riverstone.com) and email it to us at customer@riverstone.com. Please also include your home address and a headshot picture labeled with your name and date of birth.

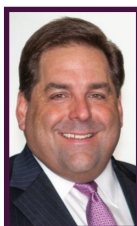

Are Your Trash Cans Compliant?

Leaving your trash can or bags outside on non-trash days may seem like a convenient solution to a household problem, but it can have negative consequences for both you and your community. It's important to understand why leaving your trash out can be problematic and what you can do to prevent it.

First and foremost, leaving your trash can or bags outside on non-trash days can attract pests and animals. Raccoons, rats, and other scavengers are attracted to the smell of garbage and can easily rip open bags and scatter trash all over the place. This not only creates an unsightly mess but can cause a big stink for the community.

Furthermore, leaving your trash outside can make your home and neighborhood less desirable. Potential buyers and renters are likely to be put off by overflowing trash cans and littered streets. This can have a negative impact on property values and may even make it difficult to sell or rent your home.

Another problem with leaving your trash bin or bags out on non-trash days is that it can violate the deed restrictions for our community. Many communities, including Riverstone have specific rules about when and where trash can be left out for collection. Violating these rules could result in fines being assessed for the violation.

To avoid these problems, it's important to follow the rules for trash day collection in your area. Make sure only to put your trash and recycle bins out on designated days and remove them from view after the trash has been collected. If you're unsure about when your trash is collected, contact your local trash company to find out their collection schedule.

It's also a good idea to properly dispose of your trash. Make sure bags are tied securely and cans are closed tightly. Consider using a lid that fits tightly on your trash can to prevent pests from getting in. If you have larger items that won't fit in your trash can, contact your local trash company to find out how to dispose of them properly.

In conclusion, leaving your trash can or bags outside on non-trash days can create a variety of problems for you and your community. By following the rules for trash collection and properly disposing of your trash, you can help keep your neighborhood clean and looking great for everyone.

Neighbor-to-Neighbor Issues



Riverstone is known for its aesthetic appeal, location, and community events. In order to maintain the high community standards that residents deserve, there are some deed restriction issues that involve neighboring properties that residents must work together to resolve. Below is a highlight of

some of the most common neighbor-to-neighbor issues Association staff sees and what the Association's role is in each.

Fencing

If a fence on a property line between two properties is in need of repair or replacement, and it enclose both properties, it is the responsibility of both property owners to repair or replace. Discussions about cost-sharing for fence replacement is a neighbor-to-neighbor issue, and the Association will not participate in these negotiations. If a neighbor does not agree that it is time to repair or replace the shared fence then the cost may fall on the resident/owner wanting to replace. The association cannot force a resident to participate or cooperate. The fence replacement must comply with the fencing guidelines, which are available online.

Tree and Shrubs

If the branches or roots of your neighbors' trees or shrubs encroach on your property, you may send them a letter offering them a one-month period to stop the encroachment (by trimming the branches and/or blocking the roots with a root barrier), after which you reserve the right to take action on your own property without liability for any damage caused by the neighbor's plants. The Association does encourage you to communicate with your neighbor before beginning work.

Parking

Your neighbors have the right to park their vehicles at the street curb, and the association will not act regarding this issue unless:

1. there is a specific violation of the Association's parking regulations and
2. the Association is able to obtain photographic proof of the violation and
3. the association is able to determine who owns the vehicle

In regard to #3, please note the Association does not have the ability to determine ownership of the vehicle based on the license plate number. The Association's parking regulations are available online. Log into the Resident Portal for Riverstone HOA on www.Riverstone.com: on the homepage menu, find community info, then click Resource Center. Locate RSHOA Policies and guidelines and click Compliance. This will allow you to view Parking Rules and Regulations. For violations of laws pertaining to vehicles and parking (such as parking in front of a fire hydrant), these should be reported to the Sheriff, not the Association.

Noise

The association does not have deed restrictions that prohibit noise, nor do we have the equipment to measure noise level. If there is a noise disturbance caused by children, parties, equipment, animals, or other causes, please discuss this with your neighbor.

When residents work together to solve these shared issues as they arise, the resolutions are often quicker and more efficient. Please also note that the Association is unable to share your neighbors personal contact information with you so you will need to reach out to your neighbor personally.

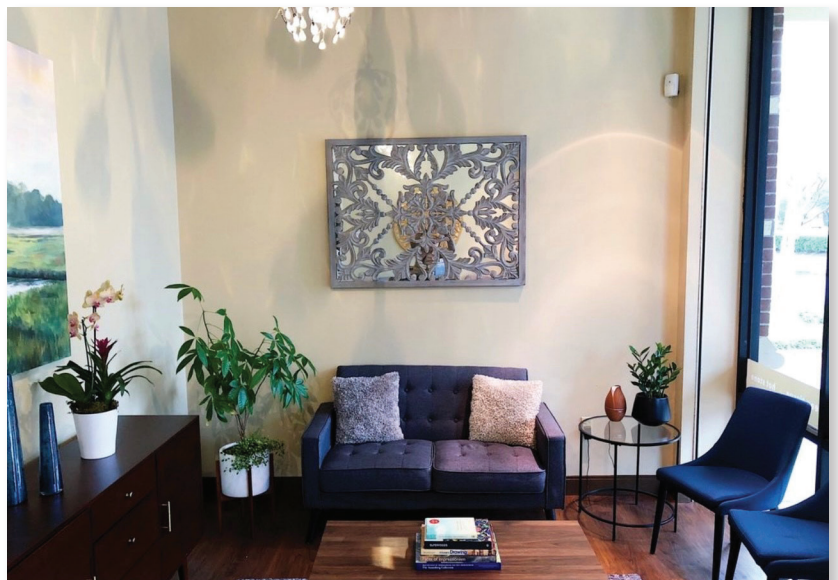

Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight

Dedicated to improving adult literacy and English language proficiency among individuals living in Fort Bend County, the Literacy Council of Fort Bend County has been making a significant impact for more than 35 years.

The organization got its start in 1987 when a group of concerned citizens sat at a kitchen table discussing the impact of low literacy rates on the Fort Bend community and decided to do something about it.

“Lucia Street was the first Executive Director and the driving force behind the establishment of the Literacy Council,” said Sally Kubiak, Interim Executive Director for the Literacy Council of Fort Bend County. “Since the beginning, services have been provided by trained volunteers, and this approach continues today.”

Kubiak said one in five adults in Fort Bend County does not have basic literacy skills. Adults with limited literacy skills may not be able to do the tasks many people take for granted.

“Often, these adults are smart yet work in low-paying jobs because of an inability to read at a basic level,” she said. “They are unable to help their children with homework, read notes from school or medical professionals, communicate effectively in writing with teachers or medical professionals, or participate in community activities. Students without a high school diploma or GED often cannot advance in their job as certification programs require a diploma or GED as a prerequisite.”

The reasons someone might not be literate are varied and include English being a second language, learning disabilities or behavioral issues that impaired learning, lack of parental support, or having to drop out of school to help support their family.

“This is not an exhaustive list but gives you an idea of what students share with us,” Kubiak said. “By the time they acknowledge they need help and come to the Literacy Council of Fort Bend County, their motivation is strong as is their commitment to succeed no matter what their literacy level.”

The Literacy Council offers a variety of programs to meet the diverse needs of its learners. These programs include one-on-one tutoring, small group instruction, and computer-assisted instruction. The organization also offers workplace literacy programs to help employees improve their reading, writing, and communication skills.

Last year, the organization served more than 450 adults in one or more of the programs, which include English as a Second Language, basic literacy and math skills, GED preparation, basic computer skills and citizenship classes.

Classes are taught at the organization’s main location in Sugar Land as well as five outreach locations, including Fort Bend Hope and Joy Lutheran Church in Rosenberg, Friends of North Richmond and

Grand Parkway Baptist Church in Richmond, and Living Word Lutheran Church in Katy.

Kubiak said that the Literacy Council will expand its outreach program as new sites are identified. All classes are taught by volunteers.

“Our volunteers come from all walks of life,” she said. “While some have teaching backgrounds, we also have engineers, doctors, accountants, managers and supervisors from a variety of companies. Name a profession, and we probably have had volunteers who work in that area or retired from it.”

The Literacy Council trains and supports the volunteers as well as providing them with curriculums to use. They seek to provide the best match for students and volunteers. Last year, 76 volunteers tutored classes.

“The Literacy Council is a wonderful place to volunteer as we are changing lives every day by improving literacy skills,” Kubiak said. “As students improve their literacy skills, their families, employers and communities’ benefit. As a non-profit agency, we are grateful for those who give their time, talents and resources to make a difference in adult literacy.”

Classes are offered 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday as well as Friday mornings at the Sugar Land location, 12530 Emily Court. Most classes are offered twice a week for 90 minutes each class. New tutor training/orientation is offered once a month at the Sugar Land location. Class times vary at other locations.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #9 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts. They are available for walk-on play during tennis court hours. Please be mindful when using the courts for walk-on play and limit your time to a maximum of 2 hours.
- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.
- Remember that court reservations will be forfeited after 15 minutes of not showing up for scheduled start time.
- Tennis courts are for the use of tennis or pickleball play only. Any other sports or equipment are strictly prohibited. For more information refer to rule #4 at the Resource Center under Community Info.
- Parking for use of Tennis Courts 9 & 10 is at the Riverstone Blvd Recreation Center. Please refrain from parking within the Parkside neighborhood.

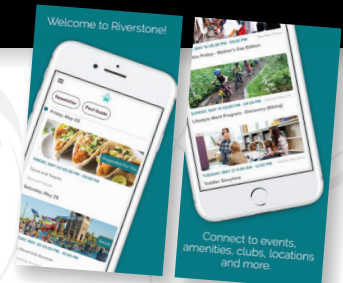
