- 4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.
- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

Compliance Reminders

Spring is here, Summer is fast approaching, and we all know the grass in Texas will flourish. Lawns that are left unmaintained for more than a week can quickly become unsightly. Therefore, we encourage all residents to maintain their property on a weekly basis during this time by mowing their lawns, edging their driveways and walkways, and weeding their yards (don't forget about the expansion areas between the concrete slabs).

PRESSURE WASHING

Pressure Washing helps remove dirt, mildew, and other stains from your house, sidewalks, and driveways. Typically, mildew and mold begin to grow on the shady areas of homes upon weather changes. Take a moment to walk around your property to visually inspect your house for any mold or mildew that needs to be cleaned.

TREE TOPPING

Many people think that you can shorten a tree by cutting off the top. What they don't realize is that topping permanently disfigures and damages the tree and may even kill it. Tree topping is not the proper way to maintain trees and is, therefore, considered a violation of the Riverstone restrictions. Please note that you may be required to replace trees that have been topped.

PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG

Just a friendly reminder. Please Pick Up After Your Pet. It doesn't take



much to remember that we have pets in our community. In fact, if you don't watch your step, you're liable to step in one such reminder!

When walking your dog in our community, remember that it should be leashed.

Also, it is important to remember to immediately clean up after your pet. Take along a baggie with you to pick up waste with and then dispose of it properly. By taking a few simple steps to clean up after your pet, you can contribute not only to the beautification of our community, but also towards the elimination of one of the most irritating nuisances in our community.

REMINDERS ABOUT TRASH

One of the most common violations that the Compliance Department sees throughout the community Is Trash/Recycle bins left in public view along with trash bags left out on the curb on non-trash days. This distracts from the overall appearance of our community and is a simple issue to correct. Please remember to store trash and recycle bins out of public view on non-trash days. This includes trash bags with lawn clippings left on the driveway or at the curb. Storing your garbage and recycling containers in public view on non-trash days is against deed restrictions. Prohibited locations include but not limited to in front of garage doors, bins left in the street, on side of the house, or on the porch. All trash/recycling should be placed in the appropriate trash or recycling containers with a tight-fitting lid. This is not only per the deed restrictions, but it also helps to keep animals from getting into the trash and scattering it down the street for your neighbors to pick up.

We would also like to remind residents that if you are using one of the parks in our community, please do not leave trash or trash bags on the ground if there is no room in the trash container at the park or common area. If there is no room left for trash in the trash bin, please take the excess trash with you to help keep our parks and common areas clean and tidy.

Calling All Volunteers

Annually, the Riverstone HOA Board appoints resident volunteers as members on various committees that have been created specifically geared towards different areas of interest. A few committees that are currently seeking members include the Foundation Committee, the Landscaping Committee, and the Gated Neighborhood Committees.

Finance Committee—This committee will work alongside the HOA Staff and Board to review short—and long-term investments in Riverstone HOA funds, Riverstone's HOA Annual Operating Budget, capital requirements, reserve studies, and insurance coverage.

Foundation Committee—This committee works alongside the HOA Staff and Board to review grant applications and select projects and programs believed to best reflect the needs and interests of the community. Foundation fees are primarily usted to fund community events, health and wellness, technology, education, the environment, and enhancements to infrastructure within the community.

Gated Neighborhood Committees—Responsible for recommending service levels and providing input on reserve projects for their respective Gated Neighborhood (such as gate operations, landscaping, camera systems, etc.). They also provide input on annual Gated Neighborhood Assessment levels and annual budgets. *Finance Committee*—This committee will Work alongside the HOA Staff and Board to review short and long-term investments of Riverstone HOA funds, Riverstone's HOA Annual Operating Budget, capital requirements, reserve studies, and insurance coverage. Landscape Committee—Residents serving on this committee shall assist in identifying landscaping-related projects, as needed. They shall coordinate yard of the month and annual holiday decorating contest, as well as, help HOA staff identify areas that may not accurately reflect the pride of this community (i.e., littering) and work with HOA staff to brainstorm and implement ideas that promote taking pride in our community.

Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight



Families are created in many ways. One of them is adoption. When that's the case, many Houston-area families turn to Rainbow of Love (ROL).

Founded in Fort Bend County in 2003 by Riverstone resident Dr. Debbie Richards, Rainbow of Love is a licensed 501(c)(3) non-profit social service organization and licensed child-placing agency.

"Rainbow began as an adoption agency that specialized in infant adoption in 2003," said Wilson Sanabria, Contract Manager for Rainbow of Love. "It now provides adoption for children waiting in foster care along with other social and humanitarian services."

When ROL was founded, most agencies that completed adoption services were either strictly working with infants or working with the state of Texas to place waiting foster children. Dr. Richards saw a need for an agency that could provide both types of adoption services.

Rainbow of Love now provides a variety of social service programs, humanitarian programs and child placing programs. They include parenting classes, home study services, counseling, domestic adoption, state adoption, hospital sitting, diaper program, youth programs and emergency assistance and referrals. Each year ROL hosts social work and business interns from various universities and countries, as well.

Rainbow of Love supports the development of children from pregnancy to age 25. The Domestic Adoption program placed babies and toddlers up to age 5. The Adoption from Foster Care program placed children from ages 6 to 17. The non-profit also helps families in need.

The agency receives an average of 50 calls from pregnant women and women with young children per year, Sanabria said.

"Not all of these women are considering adoption, most just want help," he said. "We help when we are able with basic needs. When we cannot help, we collaborate with other agencies. For the women who are considering adoption, we provide information on adoption and at the appropriate time, allow her to select a family for her child."

Rainbow of Love also provides resources and support for youth who have aged out of foster care or who are experiencing periods of invisible homelessness through the Youth Helping Youth Program. Invisible homelessness refers to youth who do not have an address and move from one friend's couch to another.

Among the many other services provided is a program providing families with diapers and wipes on a monthly basis. At Christmas the program helps provide these families with toys and new clothing. Counseling and parenting classes are also available.

"The parenting program is for parents who have an open case with DFPS and they are required to take a class," Sanabria said. "We also have people who are divorcing taking the class and people who just went to improve their parenting skills."

Counseling services are offered primarily to mothers and youth who are experiencing crisis to support mental health, assist with social and personal issues, prevent crisis and promote growth and development.

Rainbow of Love has 12 people on staff, including social workers, adoption specialists, case managers and administrative staff. They also gratefully accept volunteers for special events like Baskets for Babies or Mother's Day Baskets. Riverstone residents can also help the organization by donating diapers and wipes, new baby clothes and monetary donations as well as by supporting fundraising events and donating office space.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- · Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #9 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts. They are available for walk-on play during tennis court hours. Please be mindful when using the courts for walk-on play and limit your time to a maximum of 2 hours.
- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.
- Remember that court reservations will be forfeited after 15 minutes of not showing up for scheduled start time.
- Tennis courts are for the use of tennis or pickleball play only. Any other sports or equipment are strictly prohibited. For more information refer to rule #4 at the Resource Center under Community Info.
- Parking for use of Tennis Courts 9 & 10 is at the Riverstone Blvd Recreation Center. Please refrain from parking within the Parkside neighborhood.
