



Taking the Myth out of Foundation Fees An Introduction to YCFC

Historical Perspective

Sienna Plantation was the first JDC community to implement fees in 1999 A foundation fee is collected at each closing as a percentage of the sales price of each home.

This fee is collected each time a property is sold and accrues. Foundation fees are set aside to create a unique revenue stream that is different from normal HOA assessments.

Foundation Fees help protect, sustain and even enhance the property. They fund projects related:





Foundation Fees Foundation fees not only improve the infrastructure of a JDC community, they also enhance the heart of the community. Historically, fees have funded school grants, Eagle Scout projects, contributions to nonprofit organizations, and The Children's Catastrophic Fund.



Community Involvement

YCFC is an appointed group of citizens who partner with the Homeowners Association to evaluate grant requests believed to be in the best interest of the community.

"Foundation fees provide a unique revenue stream, not available in most residential developments. Residents have comfort and pride in knowing the level of quality of the resources that exist in their community today will continue and likely be enhanced in the future."

- Cleaned and sealed monument signs




