ALL holiday décor must be removed on or before January 25th.

For residents living in gated sections, please observe the following notes regarding requests to have the gates open for events at your home. Please submit your "Holiday Time" requests (request to have the gates open) to the HOA at least two full business days in advance. This will help ensure that your request gets processed in time for your event.



2017 Budget Review



Why do we have Assessments and what do they cover?

When you live in a master planned community, there are many advantages that are not available to owners who are not a part of a homeowners association. One of the biggest advantages would be the protection of your property values. Having Rules and Regulations, Architectural Guidelines, Deed Restrictions, By-Laws and State and Federal Statutes were designed to protect your interest by regulating many of the nuisances that usually effect your property value.

Your assessment helps to fund the operating cost for your association and is an investment in your community as well as your home.

How does the Association pay for the expenses?

81% of the Associations income is funded through the community assessments that are collected at the beginning of each year. The other 19% are through additional fees collected.

Where are the majority of our assessments going?

The largest expense for the community is Landscaping. Almost 53% of the community budget goes towards the maintenance of the landscaping.

What are the operating costs for Riverstone Homeowners Association?

The total operating costs for your community for 2017 are budgeted at \$ 6,890,349.00.

This includes maintenance for all common areas to include:

- Landscaping
- Recreation Facilities
- Common Area Amenities
- Lakes

Along with all common areas, the association pays for services to the Community to include:

- Deed Restriction enforcement
- Architectural Reviews
- Processing Remotes and Amenity Cards


