Hurricane Harvey

These past several weeks have been incredibly difficult on our community, as many of our residents were heavily impacted by Hurricane Harvey. And yet Riverstone came together in this time of need; with neighbors helping each other with the initial process of rebuilding homes and restoring our community.

We worked alongside you and thousands of volunteers to distribute needed supplies, clear streets, and begin restoration on homes after the storm. Now, as we continue to work on restoring Riverstone and help bring things back to normal, we want to provide an update and share valuable information with you.

Removing the debris from front yards and cleaning our streets continues to be our priority, and we have been diligently working with Fort Bend County to complete this as fast as possible. We know how important this is, and by now most streets have been cleared. We expect all will be completed in the coming days.

Helping support rebuilding efforts has, too, been a top priority. We are collaborating with the Greater Houston Builders Association to share with all residents contact information of reliable contractors as well as accurate information and specifications for the materials used in each home according to the original builder. You can find this information in the Riverstone Intranet.

Knowing how valuable it is to bring families together and engage in creative and entertaining activities, especially for children, we have conducted and continue to plan opportunities to enjoy as a community. We recently entertained more than 200 residents at Movie Night in the Park and look forward to seeing you in upcoming activities, which are posted in our Facebook page.

Finally, while many of you heard this at the LID 19 meeting on Monday September 18, let us restate that we are resolved to working with the LID to determine the root cause of the flooding caused by Hurricane Harvey. This is the first step to making our community more resilient to flooding. Please know we will support any water management improvements to help prevent this from happening again.

Both Riverstone Development & the Riverstone Homeowners Association are working hard to help our residents feel comfortable and one step closer to being at home once again. On behalf of Constable Trever Nehls and the Fort Bend County Precinct 4 Constable's Office, we want you to know that we understand that recovering from flood damage can be a lengthy and burdensome process. Our goal is to always provide the best information possible

to help you to protect yourself and from becoming victims of crime. To help avoid scams as you rebuild from destructive floods, keep these tips in mind:

- · Be wary of door-to-door contractors asking for money up front.
- Don't provide financial information over the phone.
- Ask to see a contractor's license and insurance information.
- Get multiple estimates before choosing a contractor.
- Look for suspicious activity and report accordingly while occurring.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court. Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.

Update for Court Reservation

- S For your convenience, starting September 1, 2017 tennis court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and tennis court #1 at Riverstone Blvd will be designated as a walk-on court, no reservations will be allowed.
- Keep in mind that according to Riverstone's tennis rules and regulations rule #11 prohibits the booking of back to back times on the same court. Anyone reserving back to back times on the same court the second booking will be unreserved by the site administrator.


