Constable Corner

On behalf of Constable Trever Nehls, the Fort Bend County Precinct 4 Constable's Office wants you to be safe as we prepare for the holidays. As the shopping and holiday outings begin, we want you to be safe and have provided some safety tips to help you get through the holidays.

Here are some things to think about when shopping:

- When parking your vehicle to go shopping, remember where you parked it! Always park in a well-lit and well-traveled area. Do not park in a remote dark area.
- Do not open your car door to anyone in a parking lot or garage. If you believe you are in danger, call 911 immediately.
- Lock your vehicle and put your windows up even while you are driving or just sitting in vehicle.
- Don't talk on a cell phone when walking to and from your vehicle. Keep your full attention on your surroundings.
- If you are ready to leave the shopping area and feel uneasy about entering the parking lot or garage by yourself, stay inside of the location you are at and ask for a security escort.
- Have your keys in hand when approaching your vehicle. You will be ready to unlock the door and will not be delayed by fumbling and looking for your keys.
- Don't electronically unlock your vehicle until you are within door opening distance. This helps to stop someone from getting into the car and waiting to strike when you least expect it.
- When you return to your vehicle, scan the interior of your car to be sure no one is hiding inside. Check to see if you are being followed. If you believe you are being followed, set off your panic alarm of your vehicle and/or yell for help.
- If you believe you are being followed in your vehicle, drive to your nearest police station and/or call 911 and follow instructions provided by dispatch.
- When storing items purchased at the stores, place them out of sight. The best place is in a locked trunk.
- Do not leave your purse, wallet, or cellular telephone in plain view. (Vehicle/Shopping Basket)
- If you go to an automatic teller machine for cash, check for people around and make sure it is well lit and in a safe location.
- Carry only the credit cards you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Call in any suspicious activity, while it is occurring or as soon as possible.

Here are some things to think about while out of town:

- Put a hold on your mail or arrange for someone to pick it up for you, so postal worker does not leave notice on your door.
- Make arrangements for packages to be picked up or delivered somewhere where they are not left outside to be stolen. (Check tracking)
- Have a neighbor/friend check on your house regularly at different times. (Remove flyers, cards, etc.)
- Cancel newspaper prior to leaving.
- Always set alarms when gone, even if for a short time. (Test alarm/cameras with your provider)
- Do not leave valuables and/or enticing property in plain view. (Vehicles, outside, garage, residence)
- Do not leave boxes outside for trash pickup that displays what is inside of your house. (Tear down and put in bag)

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court. Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Riverstone's Tennis rules and regulations rule #11 prohibits the booking of back to back times on the same court. Second booking will be unreserved by the system administrator.
- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #1 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts.
- Only authorized professionals are allowed to teach at both Riverstone's locations.






