HOA Reserve Account What It is, Why We Need It, and How It is Funded

What are HOA Reserve Accounts?

Reserve accounts (also referred to as "reserve funds" or simply "reserves") are funds set aside by the Homeowners' Association to pay for the replacement or repair of community property. Reserves are intended to prevent the need for special assessments if/when the HOA encounters a large or unexpected expense. For example, repairs to HOA common areas after Hurricane Harvey were paid out of the Reserve Account as they were both large and unexpected (thus, unbudgeted). Without this "savings account", the HOA would need to create a Special Assessment charged to all homeowners in the middle of the year to cover these unexpected expenses. As the years go by, and our assets age, their repair and/ or replacement is inevitable, and the Reserve Account is designed to cover those costs.

How Is It Funded and How Much Money Should Be in the HOA Reserve Account?

Riverstone's HOA Reserve Account is funded in two ways: First, the majority of the funds are collected at the resale of every property. Every homeowner pays into the Reserves when they buy their home as a one-time fee. This Reserve Account Payment is equal to 100% of the Annual Regular Assessment. Secondly, a small portion of your Annual Regular Assessment (approximately 3% of your 2018 Assessment) is also deposited into the Reserve Account.

Just as you might have a formula for maintaining a certain amount in your personal savings account (three to six months' worth of your salary, for example), the HOA must determine an appropriate amount to put in its reserve account. An HOA commonly has an outside accountant prepare a "reserve study," which sets out a long-term schedule of likely costs and repairs. The reserve study will, in most cases, estimate the cost and timing of the repairs and replacements to the common areas that will likely be needed over the next 20 to 30 years. For example, if the reserve study anticipates that the clubhouse will need a new roof in ten years, the study's schedule will spread out the estimated cost of the repairs over the ten-year period, and advise that the HOA collect enough in periodic dues to set an apportioned amount into the reserve account in each of those ten years.

While it still might be too early to cut back dead plant material, replacing faded mulch with new mulch is an easy way to quickly improve the appearance of landscaping beds. Not only is new mulch aesthetically pleasing, but it also serves a practical purpose. Mulch helps insulate plant roots from extreme temperatures, helps prevent the growth of weeds, and helps retain water for plant use.



Please note that per the Riverstone Residential Design Standards, RED MULCH is prohibited. The standards may be viewed online at www.rshoa.org, in the "Resource Center", under "RSHOA Governing Documents". Curb Appeal Checklist

The curb appeal of our community depends on each resident maintaining his or her property in a clean, safe condition, while conforming with standards as set forth in the Riverstone governing documents. For those who keep their homes

and yards well-maintained, the Association thanks you for your efforts! We encourage all residents to pay particular attention to the following maintenance items:

- Exterior Paint—Paint is a guick and easy way to keep your property looking fresh, new and clean. It will also protect against corrosion, weathering and insects.
- Landscaping—Landscaping is extremely important to our community's curb appeal. Please remove dead plants and branches. Keep shrubs properly pruned and flowers well-tended. Keep yards free of leaves and remove grass clippings.
- Roofs—Please insure your roofs are properly maintained and cleaned.
- Driveways and Sidewalks— Please repair cracks, pitted or flaking surfaces and other concrete problems. Remove weeds from sidewalk
 - joints and debris from driveways and sidewalks. Do not use driveways for storage or auto repairs.
- Gutters and Downspouts—Please keep them cleaned out to prevent overflowing and flooding.
 - Trash Cans—Please remember to remove trash cans and recycling bins from the street in a timely manner and store them so they are adequately screened from public view.

All modifications made to the exterior of your home need prior approval from the Architectural Review Committee. Riverstone deed restrictions, modification guidelines, and modification applications are available on both the Resident Intranet located at www.riverstone.com, as well as Riverstone HOA's new website www.rshoa.org. While many residents enjoy receiving local newspapers, uncollected papers can become both a security risk, as well as an eyesore. Papers which do not get picked up in a timely manner make a residence appear uninhabited; making it a potential target for thieves. Furthermore, uncollected papers diminish the overall aesthetic appearance of the community.

Here's how you can help:

- Collect newspapers from the front of your residence the same day they are delivered

Tennis Court Etiquette






