HOA CORNER

Is That Plant Dead or Alive? By Carla McCabe, The Spencer Company

Arctic air that rarely reaches the Houston area showed us that we are not immune to the affects of freezing temperatures and that some plants suffered the consequences more than others. The brown leaves and stems on the affected plants begs the question . . . are they dead or alive?

The answer to that question largely depends on the type of plant and the extent of its exposure to the freezing temperatures. Here are some 'Rules of Thumb' to help you decide whether to clean up the damaged growth or remove the dead plant. Hopefully these guidelines will be helpful in determining the best course of action.

Ground Covers such as Liriope, Aztec Grass and Asian Jasmine will show freeze damage on the tops of the leaves, While unsightly, the damaged leaves will prevent the rest of the plant from being damaged should we receive another freeze prior to Spring. Cut them back in late February or early March before the new growth begins to emerge from the base or crown of the plant. Soft stemmed plants such as Elephant Ears and split leaf philodendron will have soggy leaves that should also be removed before the new

growth emerges.

Many perennial plants, such as Bulbine, Ruellia, Foxtail Fern, Asparagus Fern, Daylily, Salvia, Mexican Heather and Coreopsis are root hardy and will likely come back in the Spring. The new growth on these plants will also emerge from the base/crown, so again it will be necessary to remove damaged stems and leaves before the new growth emerges.

Tropical's and Palms were hardest hit by the freeze. Bougainvillea should not be cut back until all danger of frost has passed and the plant has started to put on new leaves. Most Hibiscus in our area that was not protected did not survive, however you can easily verify that by scratching the woody surface with a fingernail. If it's dead, the bark will come off the stem easily. Though some Palms in our area are showing signs of freeze damage, most survived with only minimal damage to the existing fronds. Check the base of the fronds where they emerge from the trunk; if there is any green there, leave the plant alone for now and remove the old and then remove the damaged fronds once the new growth begins to emerge in the spring.

To help make 'Frosty' just a memory of this past winter and promote the recovery of your plants. it's a good idea to fertilize your plantings in early Spring.



The Association office frequently receives calls regarding trash service. We hope the following information will help clear up any questions you may have!

The Riverstone community is served by two different waste and recycling companies: Best Trash and WCA Waste Corporation. Best Trash provides service to residents with a Sugar Land address, as well as residents in Stonebrook. WCA provides trash and recycling service for Riverstone residents who have a Missouri City address, excluding residents who live in Stonebrook, The charge for trash/recycling service will appear on your Si Environmental (832.490.1600) monthly bill.

Both Best Trash and WCA offer pick up of heavy trash (e.g. unwanted appliances, furniture, and yard trimmings) at no additional charge. They will NOT pick up hazardous waste or chemicals such as gasoline and car batteries. Additionally, they will NOT pick up loose building materials and waste generated by a private contractor. If you are planning a home renovation project, please make certain to discuss proper waste disposal with your contractor. For more detailed information regarding proper disposal of heavy items and guidelines for appliances and yard trimmings, please refer to each company's respective website.

If your home is newly constructed, call Best Trash to request a 64-gallon recycling bin. (Previously-owned residences should already have a recycling bin.) Residents need to provide their own 30-50 gallon waste container. Waste containers can be purchased at local home improvement stores.

Getting Along with Your Gates

The Riverstone community is comprised of both gated and non-gated neighborhoods, with approximately 1550 occupied homes located in one of the access-controlled (gated) neighborhoods. The 24 operational gates that serve these neighborhoods are made up of many different moving parts and technology. For example, a toll tag reader is positioned at the entrance to the neighborhood and allows the gate to 'read' and respond to toll tags. Internet and phone lines allow for entry with unique 4-digit codes, as well as the ability to dial phone numbers and respond to number pad tones. The operator is the 'motherboard' of the gate and is comprised of a gear box, motor, and control board. Other gate components include tracks and rollers (slide gates) or hinges and arms (swing gates). As you can see, there are many different elements that come into play to physically open and close a gate!

With so many different components, it is necessary to regularly check the operation of the gates to ensure they are functioning properly. While Riverstone HOA schedules regular, preventative maintenance inspections (PMIs) to help keep the gates running smoothly, sometimes mechanical and/or technical issues arise which are undetectable in a PMI. Some mechanical and technical issues are quick fixes—e.g. gate operators just need to be reset, an 'override' code just needs to be entered for a toll tag. Other times an inspection, diagnosis, and finally repair by a 3rd party gate contractor may be necessary to get the gate functioning again. The severity of the problem, the availability of part(s), and the schedules of contractors can all play a role in the time it takes for a gate to once again be operational.


While Riverstone HOA staff members regularly drive through gates to make sure they are functioning properly, don't hesitate to report gate issues to us. The easiest way to do this is by reporting the problem on the LUKE app. (Please refer to the inside front cover for more information on LUKE.) Residents may also report gate issues by emailing the Operations Team at operations@rshoa.org or by calling the HOA office at 281.778.2222.

To improve communication, Riverstone HOA has started sending out emails to residents within a gated neighborhood when it becomes necessary for their gate to be left open for more than a few days. If you wish to be added to the gate distribution list, please email kaylab@rshoa.org.

Tips to Help You 'Get Along with Your Gate'

- Visit the HOA office to set up toll tag information, create a 4-digit code, and provide name/phone number to be listed in your gate's directory.
- Do not share your 4-digit code with others. Have guests locate your name in the directory and have the gate call the number you provided. You can then open the gate by pressing '9' from that phone.
- Throwing a party? Contact the HOA office for a temporary code to allow guests entry.
- When entering the neighborhood, drive close to the toll tag reader. Please contact the HOA office if you do not know where the reader is located for your gate.
- Do NOT "bump" the gates to try to get them to open. This will damage the gates and prevent them from functioning properly.
- Do NOT enter through the exit gate, or exit through the entry gate. Again, this can impede the gate's ability to function properly.
- Leave all rodent traps in place around gate entrances. Rodents chew through phone

- and internet lines impairing their ability to send/receive information.
- Construction can also damage the lines. Make certain to locate lines before digging.
- Report misconduct at gates immediately! Please provide as much information as possible including the date, time, and license plate information if available.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- 🐼 Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- 🕟 Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- 🐼 When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court. Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.

- Riverstone's Tennis rules and regulations rule #11 prohibits the booking of back to back times on the same court. Second booking will be unreserved by the system administrator.
- (3) Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #1 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts.
- ① Only authorized professionals are allowed to teach at both Riverstone's locations.




