HOA CORNER

Getting Along with Your Gates


The Riverstone community is comprised of both gated and non-gated neighborhoods, with approximately 1550 occupied homes located in one of the access-controlled (gated) neighborhoods. The 24 operational gates that serve these neighborhoods are made up of many different moving parts and technology. For example, a toll tag reader is positioned at the entrance to the neighborhood and allows the gate to 'read' and respond to toll tags. Internet and phone lines allow for entry with unique 4-digit codes, as well as the ability to dial phone numbers and respond to number pad tones. The operator is the 'motherboard' of the gate and is comprised of a gear box, motor, and control board. Other gate components include tracks and rollers (slide gates) or hinges and arms (swing gates). As you can see, there are many different elements that come into play to physically open and close a gate!

With so many different components, it is necessary to regularly check the operation of the gates to ensure they are functioning properly. While Riverstone HOA schedules weekly, preventative maintenance inspections (PMIs) to help keep the gates running smoothly, sometimes mechanical and/or technical issues arise which are undetectable in a PMI. Some mechanical and technical issues are quick fixes-e.g. gate operators just need to be reset, an 'override' code just needs to be entered for a toll tag. Other times an inspection, diagnosis, and finally repair by a 3rd party gate contractor may be necessary to get the gate functioning again. The severity of the problem, the availability of part(s), and the schedules of contractors can all play a role in the time it takes for a gate to once again be operational.

While Riverstone HOA staff members regularly drive through gates to make sure they are functioning properly, don't hesitate to report gate issues to us. The easiest way to do this is by reporting the problem on the LUKE app. (Please refer to the inside front cover for more information on LUKE.) Residents may also report gate issues by emailing the Operations Team at operations@rshoa.org or by calling the HOA office at 281.778.2222.

To improve communication, Riverstone HOA sends out emails to residents within a gated neighborhood when it becomes necessary for their gate to be left open for more than a few days.

TIPS TO HELP YOU 'GET ALONG WITH YOUR GATE'



- Visit the HOA office to set up toll tag information, create a 4-digit code, and provide name/phone number to be listed in your gate's directory.
- Do not share your 4-digit code with others. Have guests locate your name in the directory and have the gate call the number you provided. You can then open the gate by pressing '9' from that phone.
- Throwing a party? Contact the HOA office in advance for a temporary code to allow guests entry.
- When entering the neighborhood, drive close to the toll tag reader. Please contact the HOA office if you do not know where the reader is located for your gate.
- Do NOT "bump" the gates to try to get them to open. This will damage the gates and prevent them from functioning properly.
- Do NOT enter through the exit gate, or exit through the entry gate. Again, this can impede the gate's ability to function properly.
- While there are sensors to prevent the gate from closing while vehicles are entering and exiting, please refrain from stopping within the gates range of motion. Doing so could cause damage to your vehicle and/or the gates.
- Leave all rodent traps in place around gate entrances. Rodents chew through phone and internet lines impairing their ability to send/receive information.
- Construction can also damage the lines. Make certain to locate lines before digging.
- Report misconduct at gates immediately! Please provide as much information as possible including the date, time, and license plate information if available.
- Finally, remember that the gates are access-control gates and do not replace security
 measures that residents should take to in regards to protecting their property.

Residents have the ability to have a box of locally sourced, sustainably grown produce delivered to them for pick up right at The Club at Riverstone. We have partnered with LOAM Agronomics to bring you fresh food from their 288-acre farm located here in Fort Bend. This is accomplished through the Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program.

A CSA Membership offers many advantages to you and to the community. Eating locally supports community farmers and provides members with produce grown without harmful pesticides. Best of all, fruits and vegetables don't spend days being transported by trucks. All produce can be on your dinner table within 48 hours of harvest.

You can choose the membership or "share" in the LOAM Agronomics' CSA that works best for you. Each week costs \$30, with recurring weekly payments. Boxes can be picked up at The Club at Riverstone

Get Farm Fresh Vegetables Delivered Each Week

every Wednesday from 3:00pm to 7:00pm. Each box contains 8-10 seasonal varieties of nutritious, delicious produce. You will also receive a members-only newsletter telling you what's in your box, current events at the farm, storage techniques, recipes curated by local chefs and invites to member events on the farm.



If you are going out of town on vacation or cannot pick up your box, you can simply login to your account and put your share on hold. It is very flexible and user friendly. Why register? Not only are you providing your family with a nutrient rich, delicious box of produce, but you are also supporting the growing local food movement in our region. Plus, you'll receive the convenience of having the farm share delivered right here to Riverstone!

Constable Corner

On behalf of Constable Trever Nehls, the Fort Bend County Precinct 4 Constable's Office wants you to be safe and inform you how to help us in preventing vehicle burglaries.

Here are some things to think about to help try and prevent being a victim:

- Securing your vehicle: make sure all doors are locked and windows are up. (There is always a possibility of windows being smashed. However, vehicles left unsecured are often targeted.)
- Hide or remove all valuables from your vehicle: removing valuables is recommended. (Vehicles may be more likely to be broken into when valuables are in plain view.)
- Try to park in well-lit areas: Leave your outside lights on, or park near a street light and/or in front of a surveillance camera. (Welllit areas and visible security cameras may prevent your vehicle from being targeted)

 If possible, install anti-theft devices: make sure to check batteries and test them or have them inspected. (The more protection to deter, the better)

We understand that not all vehicle burglaries can be prevented, but these tips are to help you deter possible attempts.

How Do I Get My Amenity Card?

- Please visit The Club at Riverstone during business hours. Business hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 9:00am-5:00pm and Wednesday from 8:00am-6:00pm.
- Please bring your driver's license with proof of residency (current utility bill or your HUD statement from your closing papers).
- Each family member 18 and up must show proof of residency.
- Each family member ages five and up must get a photo amenity card. Each household will receive three adult amenity cards at no cost (Ages 14 and Up). Each additional card is \$15.
- Tenants leasing a home in Riverstone may purchase amenity cards for \$15 each. Please bring your ID and current lease.
- Lost amenity cards may be replaced for \$15 each. Credit Card, Check, Money Order or Cashier's Checks ONLY. No cash accepted.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Riverstone's Tennis rules and regulations rule #11 prohibits the booking of back to back times on the same court. Second booking will be unreserved by the system administrator.
- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #1 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts.
- Only authorized professionals are allowed to teach at both Riverstone's locations.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Unauthorized Tennis Lessons
