## HOA CORNER

## **All About RSHOA Governing Documents**

HOAs use several types of governing documents to guide their operations. Here's what you need to know about each of them:

Articles of Incorporation: Articles of Incorporation essentially establish the HOA as a business, and do not contain much information other than name, location, and purpose of the incorporated community. A homeowners' association must file Articles of Incorporation with the secretary of state; Riverstone's were originally filed on May 30, 2001.

Association Bylaws: The Bylaws establish the rights and responsibilities of the incorporated entity and set the rules for enacting future rules. Simply put, the Bylaws tell the HOA how to do business. It is within adopted bylaws that an association's board procedures are established. Included in the Riverstone bylaws are terms that dictate:

- The number of HOA members permitted on the board and the number of board members necessary to qualify as a quorum necessary to vote on a matter.
- How often elections take place and if there are term limits for board members,
- · Who has a right to cast a vote for board members, and
- How board meetings must be conducted and what can be discussed.

Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&R's): CC&R's are arguably the most important documents of your community. The cover the rights and responsibilities the HOA has to its members, and vice versa. They are the "rules" of the neighborhood and describe:

- Requirements and limitations about what homeowners can do to their property,
- Maintenance obligations for the HOA and homeowners,
- · Mechanisms for rule enforcement and dispute resolution, and
- · Assessment obligations and penalties

The CC&Rs are said to "run with the land," meaning that the restrictions for the property are in place no matter who owns the property.

Other Rules and Regulations: CC&Rs provide the general guidance for "what", while the rules and regulations of an association provide the details of "how". For example, the CC&R's give the association the ability to offer an assessment payment plan while the Collection and Payment Plan Policy breaks down all the details of the plan. Riverstone has many Rules and Regulations on our website that breakdown specific details on topics ranging from solar panels and political signs, to leasing your home and reserving a tennis court.

Financial DocumentationLast among the community documents, but certainly worth your attention, is the financial documentation. On our website, you will find two important pieces of information: Budget Summaries for the past 3 years for the HOA and certain neighborhoods, and Financial Statements. These will tell you exactly where your assessment money is budgeted to go, and exactly where it is going so far this year.

## **Riverstone "Street Parking" Policy Reminders**

To help keep streets clear and allow for the unobstructed flow of traffic, the Association's Board of Directors adopted parking rules and regulations. As a reminder, please see below for some policy highlights:

#### **Non-Gated Neighborhoods**

- Registered, operational, non-commercial vehicles may not be parked in the street for more than seven (7) consecutive days.
   \*It is NOT the intent of this provision to permit the regular use of streets as parking areas, and the Association will have the sole discretion in determining whether a vehicle violates the provision.
- Parked vehicles may not obstruct sidewalks or be parked on a curb or grassy area.
- Parked vehicles may not adversely affect ingress/egress from a driveway on a daily basis.

- Commercial vehicles may be parked temporarily for the purpose of providing a service, making a delivery, or picking up materials, but only for the time necessary for such purpose.
- Recreational vehicles (ex. campers, golf carts, boats, etc.) may
  not be stored on residential lots for more than forty-eight (48)
  hours unless written request is received and approved by the
  HOA. Recreational vehicles may be stored on residential lots for
  longer periods provided they are completely concealed from public view inside a garage or enclosure approved by the HOA.

#### **Gated Neighborhoods**

- Parking on roads and alleyways owned by the HOA is prohibited.
   Vehicles left on HOA property for more than 24 hours may be towed at owner's expense with no prior notice.
- Additional parking restrictions may be set forth in a neighborhood's supplemental declarations.

## **Constable Corner**

Constable Trever Nehls and the Fort Bend County Precinct 4 Constable's Office hope you all had a fun summer. Fort Bend ISD starts school on Wednesday, August 14, 2019 and we would like to remind you that traffic will be a little busy the first week, so please be patient and courteous of others. Expect heavier than usual traffic on University Blvd, LJ Parkway, Winding Waters near Sullivan Elementary, and Oilfield Lane near Elkins High School for the first few weeks of the school year. We recommend planning ahead and beginning your morning routine a little bit earlier. Remember, school zones are meant to keep children safe as they arrive at and leave school, but they only work with everyone's help.



#### Please be aware of the following:

- Anne Sullivan Elementary school zone hours are 7:15am-8:15am and 3:15pm-4:00pm during school days.
- The speed limit during school zone hours is 20 MPH.
- When Buses are loading or unloading please DO NOT pass.
- · Only drop children off at designated drop off zones for their safety.
- When driving in school zones, watch out for student pedestrians and look for children who might dart into the street without looking for traffic.
- Slow down and watch for children congregating near bus stops throughout Riverstone.
- When on inner roads without a median, both directions of traffic MUST STOP when school bus red lights are flashing. Don't proceed until the
  bus's stop sign is closed and the lights stop flashing.
- When on main roads divided with a median (like University Blvd or LJ Parkway), vehicles in all lanes behind the bus MUST STOP. Vehicles traveling in the opposite directions may proceed, but with caution.
- Texas Law prohibits using a cell phone in an active school zone. Please don't drive distracted.
- Do not block residential driveways while parking or loading. Elkins students are not permitted to park in Stonebrook at any time.

To report a non-emergency/non-life threatening contact the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office (281) 342-4665 or 9-1-1 in an emergency, or Missouri City Police Department (281) 403-8700 if you live in Missouri City jurisdiction.

#### **Tennis Court Etiquette**

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an
  adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball
  when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

#### **Tennis Court Reminders**

- Court #6 at The Club at Riverstone and court #9 at Riverstone Blvd are designated as walk on courts.
- Only authorized professionals are allowed to teach at both Riverstone's locations.
- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only. Appointment Plus is no longer available.

#### **Unauthorized Tennis Lessons**

Recently there has been an increase of tennis lessons at Riverstone by unauthorized tennis pros. Please keep in mind that HOA rules prohibits the teaching of tennis lessons by unauthorized persons.
