NEW HOMEOWNERS NEEDING AMENITY CARDS

Welcome to Riverstone! To have amenity cards made for you, please email us the following:

1. Completed amenity card form (found at www.rshoa.org)

- 2. Deed or closing disclosure
- 3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.
- Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18
- Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.



REPLACING A LOST AMENITY CARD

The replacement of lost Amenity Cards is available for \$15 each.

If you need a replacement Amenity Card, please complete the credit card form found on our website (www.rshoa.org) and email it to us at customercare@rshoa.org. Please also include your home address and a headshot picture labeled with your name and date of birth.

Compliance Corner

Trash/Recycle Bins

Trash and Recycle bins that are left out in public view on non-trash days is one of the top violations that the Compliance department sees throughout our community. To help keep our community looking its best we want to remind all residents to remove their trash/recycle bins from public view on non-trash days. This can be achieved by placing the bins in the garage or behind a wooden fence. You may also submit an ARC application to install a storage area for the Trash and Recycle bins and have it reviewed by our ARC committee. You may obtain the ARC application on our website at www.rshoa.org

Lawn Bags

Lawn clippings that are left in bags at the curb or end of the driveway are also considered a violation of the deed restrictions. All trash, including the lawn clippings, must be placed in an appropriate container, and stored out of view on non-trash days. This will help to keep our neighborhoods looking tidy.

Treat for Weeds

Remember to treat your lawn for weeds. Landscaping beds and trees wells will need to be maintained and have any weeds removed.



Power/Pressure Washing Sidewalk or Driveway

Why is it important to power wash your sidewalk and/or driveway? Over time sidewalks and driveways collect dirt and allow mold and mildew to start growing on the concrete. When this happens and if it continues without intervention, the area may become slippery and could potentially create a hazard. It also detracts from the look of our community when dirt, stains, and mildew are easily visible from the street. This can also be true near and around pop-up drains from pools or French drains that are close to the curb. Power/Pressure washing the sidewalk and driveway areas of your property, this includes the sidewalk in front of your property and on the side if it is

a corner lot, will help to maintain the look of our community.

Pets

Pet owners are reminded that dogs should always be on a leash when out walking within the community. Additionally, residents are asked to be respectful of their neighbors when walking their dogs and to pick up after them. Nothing "stinks" worse than stepping in a surprise in your yard or on the sidewalk.

TIPS FOR SAFE NIGHTIME DRIVING



Driving at night can be tricky—especially through neighborhoods or dimly lit landscapes—so it's important to keep in mind a few basic guidelines to make sure you and your vehicle both are well-prepared for the trip. Consider the following suggestions to help get you to your destination safely.

Slow down. Riverstone is often full of pedestrians, bike riders, and children playing, even after the sun goes down. Speeding gives you less time to react and increases the severity of an accident.

Ensure headlights are aimed properly. If you think your headlights are casting light too far above or below your line of vision on the road, you may need to adjust their aim. You can do this either by following instructions in your vehicle owner's manual or seeking help from a vehicle maintenance professional.

Dim dashboard lights. Most vehicle makes and models come with a dimmer for the instrument panel. Make sure it's set to the lowest

brightness to limit distraction. Also remember to turn off overhead or visor lights while driving, which also can limit visibility at night.

Learn how to spot animals and objects. Riverstone is well-known for our abundant natual wildlife. While driving at night, be on the lookout for wildlife creatures' eyes, which can easily be spotted as pairs of glowing retinas. Any animals' eyes—like raccoons or deer—typically will reflect the light from your headlights long before their true shapes come into view.

Don't focus on headlights in oncoming traffic. Keep your eyes on the road in front of you and avoid looking into the headlights of oncoming traffic—especially if you notice a car using the high-beam headlight setting. If the headlights on the car behind you cause a glare in your rearview mirror, adjust the mirror.

Clean your windshield. Use a clean microfiber cloth or newspaper to clean the windshield—inside and out. Make sure the windshield is streak- and smudge-free before driving at night, and try to avoid wiping window condensation with your hands. Fingerprints and oils from your skin can cause streaks that limit visibility in the dark.

Know when to use your fog lights. Many vehicles come equipped with fog lights, which typically are located underneath the front headlights and are aimed low, where fog usually appears on the road. Fog lights also can be useful on a particularly dark road to further illuminate your path.

TIPS FOR THE HAPPIEST HALLOWEEN

Getting into the Halloween Spirit



Rain or Shine—Kids (and adults!) always love to celebrate Halloween every October 31st. Here are some great tips and tricks to ensure everyone has a ghoulishly good time!

1. Use Your Porch Light!

If you're celebrating by handing out goodies, leave your porch light on!

If you won't be home, or aren't celebrating, turn your porch light off. That's the signal for children and their parents to keep moving on to the next house.

- 2. Always hand out pre-packaged treats or candy alternatives like pencils or small, inexpensive toys. Home-made treats are traditionally discarded by the parents for safety reasons.
- 3. Consider being a part of the Teal Pumpkin Project. The Teal Pumpkin Project is a worldwide movement to create a safer, happier Halloween for all kids. Putting a teal pumpkin on your door-

step means you have non-food treats available. Stickers, erasers, crayons, pencils, coloring books, and sealed packages of raisins and dried fruits are good choices. This simple act promotes inclusion for trick-ortreaters with food allergies or other conditions.



- 4. Put your Pets away. You're sure you have the friendliest dog in town, but the 5-year-old at your door isn't so sure. Consider keeping Fido away from the front door for the evening.
- 5. Make sure you have a clear path to your porch. Remove anything that could cause trick-or-treaters to trip or fall on your walkway or lawn, and keep your plants safe from over-excited kids.
- 6. Eat a healthy meal or snack before trick-or-treating. Going trick-or-treating on an empty stomach can lead to overeating, so be sure your kids eat a nourishing meal or snack beforehand.

Walk Safely

- 1. Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- 2. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- 3. Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- 4. Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- 6. Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

Keep Costumes Both Creative and Safe

- 1. Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- 2. Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.

Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- 2. Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- 3. Enter and exit driveways slowly and carefully.



Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an
 adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball
 when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.

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
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


















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
