- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

## **Compliance Reminders & Tips**

The Riverstone Compliance Department encourages all residents to take a few minutes and look over their property for any potential Deed Restriction issue that may result in a violation.

- Remember to mow, weed, and edge your lawn as needed, which may include on a weekly basis during the summer months.
- Remove weeds from the landscaping beds and tree wells, and treat your yard as needed to control weeds.
- Remove any dirt and/or mildew from property, pressure wash driveways and sidewalks to remove dirt and/or stains.

Additionally, residents are asked to be respectful of their neighbors when walking their dogs and to pick up after them. Nothing "stinks" worse than stepping in a surprise in your yard or on the sidewalk.



## **Property Maintenance**

#### Power/Pressure Washing Sidewalk or Driveway

Why is it important to power wash your sidewalk and/or driveway? Over time sidewalks and driveways collect dirt and allow mold and mildew to start growing on the concrete. When this happens and if it continues without intervention, the area may become slippery and could potentially create a hazard. It also detracts from the look of our community when dirt, stains, and mildew are easily visible from the street. This can also be true near and around pop-up drains from pools or French drains that are close to the curb. Power/Pressure washing the sidewalk and driveway areas of your property, this includes the sidewalk in front of your property and on the side if it is a corner lot, will help to maintain the look of our community.

#### Trash/Recycle Bins

Trash and Recycle bins that are left out in public view on non-trash days is one of the top violations that the Compliance department sees throughout our community. To help keep our community looking its best we want to remind all residents to remove their trash/recycle bins from public view on non-trash days. This can be achieved by placing the bins in the garage or behind a wooden fence. You may also submit an ARC application to install a storage area for the Trash and Recycle bins and have it reviewed by our ARC committee. You may obtain the ARC application on our website at www.rshoa.org

#### Lawn Bags

Lawn clippings that are left in bags at the curb or end of the driveway are also considered a violation of the deed restrictions. All trash, including the lawn clippings, must be place in an appropriate container and stored out of view on non-trash days. This will help to keep our neighborhoods looking tidy.

## **Solomon Delaney Returns to Riverstone!**

We always knew Solomon Delaney was destined for great things. In 2016, we welcomed him to Riverstone as our assistant lifestyle director. Not long after, we had to say goodbye as he took on the position of lifestyle director for our sister community Jordan Ranch. Now he's back as our new Lifestyle Director.

A southeast Texas native, Solomon gained his experience through leadership positions within Stephen F. Austin

State University. He focused on bringing students together through event planning. Building communities while meeting the needs of those around him became a passion of his. Because of the role he played on campus, he became the first recipient of the SFAWAY, which is the highest leadership achievement a student can receive.

The SFAWAY was only the first award Solomon has received for his work. In 2019, his creativity and hard work at Jordan Ranch earned him a Houston's Best PRISM award for Lifestyle Director of the Year from the Greater Houston Builders Association.

At Jordan Ranch, Solomon was a one-man show planning 75+ events a year. That's as many activities as much larger communities with a staff. Some of the most memorable events he has crafted include an 80's Murder Mystery dinner, a Cigar & Scotch Night and Pet Palooza.

As our Lifestyle Director, he will be part of an entire team devoted to crafting resident events, festivals and all the other activities that make living here special.

"I am excited to be back at Riverstone and look forward to bringing my talents to the team here," Solomon said. "It really feels like a full circle."

## **Riverstone Business Spotlight**

There are many types of martial art disciplines. One gaining increasing popularity is Brazilian jiu jitsu (BJJ) a self-defense technique that emphasizes grappling over throws. Where do you start? Renzo Gracie Riverstone, which has classes for all ages.

Brazilian jiu jitsu is based on ground fighting and submission holds. Practitioners focus on taking an opponent to the ground, controlling them and gaining a dominant position thereby rendering the opponent harmless.

"Most confrontations end up going to the ground in some manner," said Professor Brian Marvin, owner of Renzo Gracie. "Our art allows you to learn all aspects of self-defense from standing as well as when situations go to the ground. The majority of our techniques are taught from the ground."

Renzo Gracie Riverstone opened mid-pandemic last year. It is the fifth Renzo Gracie studio Marvin has opened in the Houston area. The focus is not just on teaching technique but building confidence.

"Our focus is not only our students, but the community itself," Marvin said. "We build confidence to the point de-escalation is the preferred outcome with technical skills to defend yourself if de-escalation attempts fail. We waited two years to establish an academy on this very spot so families could walk, bike, or skateboard to classes."

Marvin received his black belt from Carlos Gracie, Jr., one of the most highly regarded Brazilian jiu jitsu coaches in the world. He is now a 3rd degree black belt. The other instructors at the Riverstone location have more than 15 years of experience teaching.

Instruction is available at all levels from beginners with no experience to professional athletes. Several classes are offered for children



ages 4 and up. A women's-only class taught by Ultimate Fighting Championship star Lauren Murphy is available on Sundays. Students can compete in monthly tournaments.

The benefits of BJJ are many, including lowering stress and anxiety, weight loss, strengthening and conditioning the body and self-defense.

An additional benefit, according to Marvin, is that all the Renzo Gracie academies work together so if your family joins one, they are welcome at more than 300 Gracie Barra schools worldwide.

Renzo Gracie Riverstone occupies a gorgeous 2,000-square-foot facility at 18734 University Boulevard. Training sessions are always supervised, with CPR-trained personnel on duty during every class. Cleanliness is a top priority. Mats are cleaned daily with a specially designed cleaning agent that neutralizes bacteria, fungus and odors without detriment to the equipment.

## **Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight**





There are more than 24,000 Fort Bend residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). And to care for just one person with IDD from birth through adulthood, it costs \$1.5 million. Helping the families of individuals with IDD gain access to the resources and information they need is the job of The Arc of Fort Bend County.

Founded in 1968 as a chapter of the national organization, The Arc of Fort Bend County is dedicated to offering services and advocating for people with IDD.

"In 1968, there was a group of parents who had children with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Fort Bend County who knew each other," said Laura LaVigne, Chief Operating Officer of The Arc of Fort Bend County. "There were little to no services or programs available to them. At the time, the fate of many individuals with disabilities was likely dim."

Parents often could not take part in planning or placement decisions regarding their children. Many children were placed in state institutions. This changed with the passage of Education for All Handicapped Children Act (EHA) in 1975 (now known as the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)).







Since then, significant progress has been made toward meeting major national goals for developing and implementing effective programs and services for early intervention, special education and related services.

The Arc of Fort Bend County has been part of that progress. The non-profit advocates for people with IDD, refers parents to the resources, helps parents plan for their children's transition to adulthood, offers employment assistant to adults with IDD, purchases homes to lease to qualified providers who operate them as group homes and more.

"The Arc provides a range of services and programs designed to meet the needs of families no matter the age of the child," LaVigne said. 
"We have the largest adult Special Olympics delegation in the area (more than 100 athletes) offering 10 sports year-round. We have a Social Recreation Club that offers two to three activities each month to more than 40 adults. They just enjoyed a trip to HLSR to see Maren Morris! 
We have a bowling program every Saturday at Bowlero Stafford for adults to enjoy. The youth enjoy disability-friendly activities from all around the greater Fort Bend County area."

In 2021, The Arc provided 164 hours of personalized special education training to 226 parents, hosted three support groups, matched 14 teens with peer volunteer pals, co-hosted two community resource fairs, held parents' nights out and many other services. In 2020, The Arc boasted more than 200 hours of advocacy.

Providing these services is vital. The Arc of Fort Bend is always in need of volunteers who can help with Special Olympics, youth programs and fundraising. Donations are always needed and appreciated. The Arc hosts two annual fundraisers the—"Best in the West" dinner, dance and auction as well as The Arc of Fort Bend Golf Classic (being held June 13 this year).

#### MUSCLE OF THE MONTH-FOREARM

The forearm can be brought closer to the upper arm (flexed) and brought away from the upper arm (extended) due to movement at the elbow. The forearm can also be rotated so that the palm of the hand rotates inwards (pronated) and rotated back so that the palm rotates outwards (supinated) due to movement at the elbow and the distal radioulnar joint.

Exercises for stronger forearms: Farmer's Walks, Heavy Deadlifts, Wrist Rollers, Seated Reverse Wrist Curl, Seated Wrist Curls, Dead Hangs, Grip Crushes

#### **Tennis Court Etiquette**

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an
  adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball
  when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

#### **Unauthorized Tennis Lessons**

#### ALL POOLS-FACILITY RULES

- Only residents and their guests are permitted in the pool area. All residents age five and older are required to show their Riverstone amenity card for entry to community pools. Residents will not be permitted entry without their Riverstone amenity card. If you have any questions about your current amenity card or you do not have one, please contact the Riverstone HOA at 281-778-2222.
- Residents must remain with guests at all times (no dropping off guests at facility/pool) and are responsible for their guests conduct.
- Only proper swimming attire manufactured specifically for swimming may be worn while in the pool; no cutoff shorts, sweats, t-shirts, exercise pants, sandals, etc.
- Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian over the age of 18.
- Be considerate with your language, actions, and radios.
   Any radios that are deemed too loud by the lifeguards must be turned down or off.
- Organized groups of 10 or more (including groups of residents and guests) are required to schedule a pool party reservation a minimum of 14 days in advance prior to the desired pool party date.
- · No running, horseplay, or loud and unruly conduct.
- . No pets are allowed in the pool area; except service animals.
- No alcohol or tobacco products are allowed in the pool or pool area.
- No glass containers or breakables are allowed in the pool or pool area.
- No bicycles, roller skates, skateboards, etc. are allowed in the pool or pool area.
- Obey the lifeguards at all times. They have the authority to remove anyone disobeying the rules or endangering the safety of themselves or others from the pool area.
- Patrons should immediately report to a lifeguard any incident in which a person has urinated or defecated in or around the pool, so that all necessary steps are taken to cleanse the water.
- "Safety Breaks" are conducted 10 minutes to the hour, every hour. During "Safety Break" ALL patrons MUST exit the pool.
- Procedure for Thunder: Patrons MUST exit the Water for a minimum of 30 min.
- Procedure for Lightning: Patrons MUST exit Pool Facility for a minimum of 30 min.

#### ALL POOLS—SWIMMING RULES

- Swim at your own risk.
- . No swimming is allowed unless lifeguards are on duty.
- Only "Coast Guard Approved" flotation devices are allowed. All other flotation devices such as: "noodles", "floaties" and "swimmies", etc. are prohibited from usage inside of the pool(s) and/ or water slides. It is very easy for non-Coast Guard approved devices to slip off and/ or deflate if accidentally nicked. Such devices also impede the movement of a child's arms.
- Parents and/or guardians are responsible for their children at all times. Lifeguards are on site, but children who cannot swim must have a responsible adult supervising and within arms-reach at all times. This rule also applies even when the child is wearing a Coast Guard approved flotation device.
- Children not potty trained must wear rubber pants with elasticized waist and legs over diapers when in the water.
- There is no diving allowed at any time. Nearly 90 percent of all pool-related spinal injuries occur in the shallow end of the pool.
- · No food or beverages allowed in the pool.

#### WATERSLIDE RULES (WATERPARK POOL)

- . You must be at least 48 inches tall to use either water slide.
- . Only one person is allowed on the slide at a time.
- · Flotation devices of any kind are not permitted.
- Goggles or swim masks are not permitted on slides unless necessary for prescription vision needs.
- Riders may enter the slide only when instructed by the lifeguard.
- · Riders must know how to swim to go down the slide.
- · Enter, Ride, and Exit feet first.
- · Keep hands inside slide at all times.
- Move away from the bottom of the slide quickly and do not cross in front of the other slide's exit point.

#### LILY PAD CROSSING RULES (WATERPARK POOL)

- Only one person at a time may be on the lily pads.
- No swimming or walking in the lily pad fall zone or under lily pads.
- · Parent/Adult may assist small child across pads.
- · No running across lily pads AND no diving from lily pads.
- · No pulling or tugging on rope while waiting in line.








