- 4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.
- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

## **All About Recycling!**

We love that so many of our residents opt to recycle their plastic, glass, paper and other items. The following how-tos will help make your recycling efforts even more planet-friendly:

- 1. Items should be placed loose in your recycling bin. If you must use a bag, it needs to be a clear, transparent recycling bag. If they can't see what's inside, the items will not be recycled.
- 2. Remove caps, liquids and food products from inside containers you are recycling.
- 3. If you have more items to recycle than will fit in your bin, place it in a clear bag, a box or a container that is not smaller than 30 gallons and not larger than 50 gallons. Label it "Recycle" and place it next to your regular recycling bin.
- 4. Recycle moving boxes. Flatten them and place them next to the recycling bin. Please limit the boxes to no more than 20 per recycle collection day.

### Sculptor Transforms Dead Tree Into Community Art



A dead tree outside The Club at Riverstone has received new life as a beautiful piece of community art thanks to wood carver James Phillips.

Despite our best efforts, a tree gracing our amenity complex died. Rather than chopping it down and hauling it away, we decided to turn it into something Riverstone residents could enjoy.

When our community was faced with deciding what to do about the tree at The Club, we decided to call on Philips, who carved fallen trees and stumps in Galveston after Hurricane lke 12 years ago.

Over a period of nearly three weeks, Phillips used a 36-inch large chainsaw to rough out a design. He then scaled back to smaller chainsaws and eventually an electric saw with tips that allowed for fine detailing. When the carving was complete, he finished his creation with spent motor oil.

The result was a playful sculpture featuring 10 children, three owls and four birds. It is a stunning addition to the works of art that dot our community.

## **Riverstone Pool Parties**

#### Association Regulations:

- Pool parties cannot be held during opening weekend and the weekends of Memorial Day, July 4th, or Labor Day.
- There is a \$35.00 Non-Refundable Administration Fee included in the total cost for both open-hours and after-hours pool parties.
- There is a 14-business days advance requirement for all PRI-VATE (after-hours) pool party reservations. For open-hours pool party requests, we require a 7-business days advanced notice.
- A-Beautiful Pools requires a minimum notice of 36 hours to cancel a party (except in the case of bad weather). Insufficient cancellation notice will result in NO REFUND of all charges. The Admin Fee is non-refundable.
- No Alcohol. No glass containers.
- Resident is responsible for cleaning up and disposing of all food and decorations brought into the pool area.
- While multiple open-hour pool parties will be allowed per day, a 30-minute window between parties will be held. Only one openhours pool party will be allowed at a time.

#### **Open-Hour Pool Parties (During Regular Pool Hours):**

- Maximum number of guests is 25. This includes Adults and Children. Must count everyone who enters the pool gate.
- Total cost below includes one (1) lifeguard for their party. There will be NO REFUNDS if resident decides to end party early.

#### After-Hours Pool Parties:

 Total costs below include required number of lifeguards for their party. There will be NO REFUNDS if resident decides to end party early. Included in the total cost is an additional 30 minutes, for

- Waterpark requires 12 lifeguards for 1–150 guests. 14 lifeguards for 151–200 guests.
- Creekstone Village requires 3 lifeguards for 1–60 guests. This facility has a maximum capacity of 60.
- Riverstone Boulevard requires 4 lifeguards for 1–50 guests. This facility has a maximum capacity of 50.

# Riverstone Business Spotlight YOGASIX

When Riverstone residents Cami and Aurel White decided to open a business in their community, they decided it should be something that wasn't readily available. Something beneficial to everyone. Two years ago, they opened YogaSix.



Cami and Auril own the franchise with Cami's parents Deb and Rob Morise. Cami says it is a true family business with two and soon to be three of their eight children working at the studio.

"We were looking to open a family business in the community where we bought a home," Cami said. "Yoga helped me personally in many ways, and really helped me physically and mentally after I had my seventh child and during the pregnancy of my eighth. We knew that others could benefit from it as well—the same way I did."

She acknowledges that while many people are interested in yoga, they might have reservations. She said YogaSix takes this into account.

"People have given us many reasons why they haven't started their yoga practice," she said. "Some say, 'I'm not flexible.' We can help with that! Some say, 'I don't know what I'm doing.' That's why we have teachers. As long as you know where your feet, arms, legs and back are, you'll be great in class."

Cami said that many people don't want others looking at and judging them. To counter this, YogaSix teachers keep the lights dim and encourage everyone to focus on their own practice.

"The teachers are there to help and assist, not judge and correct. We each have our own mat, and our own practice, and we can't judge ourselves based on someone else and where they are in their practice only where we are and how far each of us have personally come."

The YogaSix philosophy is that everyone deserves the mind and body benefits that yoga provides. Benefits that include increasing strength, flexibility, core strength and cardiovascular health as well as decreasing stress and anxiety, improved recovery time for athletes and lowering blood pressure.

"We love our yoga community and love that our team and our members make the effort to welcome and encourage everyone," Cami said. "We have members who have had years of experience and those who are just stepping onto the mat for the first time; we have



members looking to destress, work through an injury, gain flexibility, or movement in their lives. All are welcome."

There are currently eight teachers. One of them, Veronica Naje, is a

Master Teacher. There are only six instructors with this distinction out of 1,500 YogaSix certified trainers.

The studio currently offers seven classes: Y6 Hot, Y6 Slow Flow, Y6 Sculpt & Flow, Y6 Power, Y6 Restore, Y6 Mix (a condensed 45-minute combo of Hot, Sculpt & Restore) and Y6 Slow Jams (condensed 45-minute combo of Y6 Slow, Y6 Hot & Y6 Restore).

Cami's hands-down favorite is Y6 Hot.

"It's a set sequence, so you can see your progression from the first time you take the class to wherever you are in your practice after that," she said. "I like the predictability of the class. I turn my mind off for an hour and just flow."

Cami wants people to know that YogaSix is easy to try. Classes are taught in English using only a few Sanskrit terms. Classes are geared toward every skill level.

"All classes are all levels, meaning anyone can take any class," Cami said. "Our schedule is great with early a.m., mid-day, and evening classes to fit everyone's needs. It is important for us to keep yoga as accessible as possible to every person who walks through our door. We have a great, welcoming, encouraging and empowering community, where everyone has a place to practice."

## **Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight**

When Ammie Blahuta was told her daughter had Down syndrome, she had doubts. She wasn't sure how she would give Sadie what she needed to thrive. Her search for support led her to GiGi's Playhouse, a unique organization offering free educational and therapeutic programs to individuals with Down syndrome, their families and the community.

GiGi's Playhouse is a national non-profit organization formed to change the way the world views Down syndrome. It is the only network of Down syndrome achievement centers in the nation. These brick-andmortar locations provide a range of resources to help people with Down syndrome reach their full potential while providing families with support.

Blahuta founded the Sugar Land location after trying and failing to find the resources she needed.

"We looked for resources online and couldn't exactly find what we felt like we needed, especially not in Fort Bend County," Blahuta said. "My mom's friend, who was the special education coordinator at Terry High School, found GiGi's Playhouse Nationals online and told my mom 'This is what Ammie needs."

The Blahutas researched the organization. What caught their attention was that the non-profit believed in all individuals with Down syndrome, providing services for all ages—not just infants and children.



GiGi's extensive list of therapeutic programs are designed to provide vital gross motor, fine motor, developmental, fitness and speech and language programs. Different programs address the needs of different age groups, but all are designed to address the challenges of individuals with Down syndrome.



"The one-on-one therapies are probably the most helpful for Sadie's education and personal growth," Blahuta said. "Individuals who have Down syndrome are far more capable of doing things than some people give them credit for (especially historically speaking). It just takes them a little longer sometimes."

"Over the past year, GiGi's Playhouse Sugar Land has served 415 families, provided 6,685 free program hours and 374 one-on-one speech therapy hours.

To keep programs free and accessible to all families, GiGi's Playhouse relies heavily on volunteers. All programs except for speech therapy are run by volunteers. Blahuta said the organization always needs volunteers—especially for their one-on-one programs. She said that no experience is necessary.

"Our staff provides all the materials needed to run a successful program," she said. "The online volunteer training that is provided by our national office is a huge benefit." Consistency is our biggest struggle when it comes to volunteers. No professional degree is needed!"

GiGi's Playhouse also relies on donations. Their annual "I have a Voice" gala will take place from 6–11 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 15, at George Ranch Historical Park. The gala will be an evening of acceptance with a VIP happy hour, gourmet dinner, open bar, live music and dancing, live auction, raffle, bottles and booze pulls, boot shine station, inspiration from children and adults with the organization and more.

### **Tennis Court Etiquette**

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

### **Unauthorized Tennis Lessons**

Recently there has been an increase of tennis lessons at Riverstone by unauthorized tennis pros. Please keep in mind that HOA rules prohibits the teaching of tennis lessons by unauthorized persons.
