- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Wildlife in Riverstone—Feral Hogs

Many residents are drawn to the natural beauty of the Riverstone community, which is also home to many of Texas' native animals. Local wildlife may include deer, snakes, armadillos, raccoons, field mice/rats, nutria, alligators, birds of prey, opossums, and feral hogs.

Feral Hogs and What to Do About Them

Hogs have been an invasive species in Texas since they were imported in the 1930s. Today, there are an estimated 2.6 million hogs in Texas doing about \$400 million in damages annually. Unfortunately, Riverstone is not immune. The Association hears and shares residents' concern over this matter.

What We Are Doing

While the Riverstone HOA does not manage wildlife and cannot control which types of wildlife inhabit or migrate through the community, efforts may be taken to reduce the negative impact that wildlife have on common areas. The Association has reached out to experts, including Texas Parks & Wildlife, for feedback regarding steps that can be taken. All have confirmed baiting and trapping is not a recommended solution for our situation. These experts have, however, made recommendations that are being followed, including:




- Where possible, fencing has been installed near common and HOA reserve areas to help keep feral hogs from entering the community. However, areas that cannot be fenced—such as neighborhood openings, pipelines/utility easements, undeveloped lots and streets, and public service areas that prohibit fencing potentially allow wildlife access into Riverstone.
- In addition, the Association has worked with the Levee Improvement Districts (LID) to identify which areas within their district may be being utilized by wildlife to enter our neighborhood so they can assist with these efforts. To date the districts have installed over 15,000 feet of fencing to help keep wildlife off the levees and out of the community.
- As recommended by the experts, our landscaping company is eliminating food sources for hogs (such as sod webworms,



cutworms, and grubs) in the common areas by putting down Dylox, or similar products.

 To deter hogs from entering your individual properties, our Compliance Department and Architectural Review Committee are allowing residents to install green temporary fencing in their front yards with a 3-foot post (1 foot in the ground) for 60 to 90 days. You must submit an ARC application. If you need assistance with an ARC application, please email ARCmodification@riverstone.com for assistance.



What You Can Do

While the Association is taking steps to keep hogs out of common areas, homeowners need to do the same on their properties. Please consider the following:

- Turn back irrigation settings at your home so the grounds are not so soft and easy to root through.
- Treat your yard for grubs, worms, insects and reptiles quarterly to eliminate the hoo's food sources.

- Remove all acorns from your lawn if you have oak trees throughout your property.
- Make sure you have no standing water in your yard that hogs will use as a drinking or bathing source.
- Hogs do not like the light at night. Something as simple as solar stake lights in the yard have proven to deter hogs from locations.
 Predator guards placed at hog's eye level might be effective.
- · Do not leave any pet or human food outside.
- · Ensure that your trash is well secured and not accessible.

We've also had residents impacted by the hogs share with us a few products they have found effective:

While we do our best to monitor and maintain installed fencing, we ask that residents not disturb the fencing and notify us immediately by emailing operations@riverstone.com if any sections have been damaged or removed.

We hope this information has been of help. Working together—the Association in the common areas and residents on privately owned land—we can prevent further intrusion of feral hogs into our community.

FAQ's

1. What to do when I encounter wild hogs? (TPWD)

- a. Be calm and move slowly away from the animal. Do not approach or attempt to feed the animal.
- b. Keep a safe distance and do not corner or provoke the animal (i.e. by using a flash while taking pictures of it).
- c. If you see adults with young piglets, leave them alone.

2. Why is the Association not setting traps?

For all wild hog traps to be successful, it is critical to pre-bait—that is, to place bait in the trap for at least a week before setting the trap. Trapping without pre-baiting is ineffective. Unfortunately, pre-baiting will also attract animals and accustom them to entering the trap itself, potentially encouraging more hogs and other animals to enter the neighborhood. (Texas A&M Agri-Life Extension).

Also, the HOA is not able set traps on land it does not own. Further, trapping, including pre-baiting, may have the unintended effect of creating dangerous situations for our residents, their children, and pets who could be injured by the traps. This not only creates major concerns about the safety of our residents, it creates potential liability for everyone involved. If a claim results in a suit against the HOA, a claims history is created thereby resulting

in increased premiums which directly impacts the amount of the assessments paid by owners and the HOA's ability to obtain insurance in the future. The HOA must balance the uncertainty of success and potential disadvantages with using traps against the possible risks and liability which is created by their use.

3. How strong is their sense of smell? (Texas A&M AgriLife Extension)

A wild hog's sense of smell is well developed (much better than both their eyesight and hearing) and they rely strongly on it to detect danger and search out food. They are capable of sensing some odors 5-7 miles away and may be able to detect odors as much as 25 feet underground!

4. What do wild hogs eat? (TPWD)

Wild hogs are omnivorous, meaning they eat both plant and animal matter. They are very opportunistic feeders and much of their diet is based on seasonal availability. Foods include grasses, forbs, roots and tubers, browse, mast (acorns), fruits, bulbs and mushrooms. Animal matter includes invertebrates (insects, snails, earthworms, etc.), reptiles, amphibians, and carrion (dead animals), as well as live mammals and birds if given the opportunity. Wild hogs feed primarily at night and during twilight hours, but will also feed during daylight in cold or wet weather.

5. Can I wipe out a hog population through hunting or trapping? (TPWD)

The wild hog has managed to survive, adapt, and increase their numbers despite attempts at population control. While it is possible to keep the population in check with continuous control, it is highly unlikely to eradicate a hog population within an established range.

6. Do they use the same trails to get from place to place? If so, why? (Texas A&M AgriLife Extension)

Wild hogs are creatures of habit and will use the same bedding/ resting areas and feeding areas as long as the food source remains available. However, they are capable of moving great distances to find food. Human disturbance/pressure will make them alter their patterns of movement. They do have some affinity to their "home range" which can vary from a few hundred acres to several thousand acres based on food availability and pressure. A 2011-12 telemetry study of adult female wild hogs with sounders in east Texas resulted in home range estimates of approximately 2 square miles, or 1,100 acres.

Riverstone Business Spotlight





Rasheedah Mujtabaa's daughter's rare neuromuscular condition and her own struggle with arthritis were the catalyst for bringing a unique business to Riverstone—an alkaline water specialty store with the potential to improve health and well-being.

WaterTree Riverstone opened a year ago at Riverstone Plaza. Mujtabaa decided to open the business after she and her daughter experienced the health benefits of Water Tree products.

"We began drinking alkaline water and using a home filtration system to filter out contaminants that may have long-term effects from showering and cooking," Mujtabaa said. "After drinking WaterTree Riverstone's alkaline antioxidant water, we saw drastic improvements. I genuinely believe this is something many people can benefit from in our community, which prompted me to open this store."

Mujtabaa said business is growing as more and more people learn about the health benefits of alkaline water. Alkaline water is water with a high pH. WaterTree differs from other alkaline water brands because they do not add sodium bicarbonate (baking soda) or electrolysis to make the water alkaline. It is better for people than tap water and purified water.

"What sets us apart from purified water is that our water goes through a 12-stage filtration system to remove contaminants, toxins and water-borne diseases," she said. "Then the water goes under two UV lights. The natural minerals are then put back in the water, which makes our water naturally alkaline and rich in antioxidants and hydrogen. Purified water may go through only a few filtration processes. Purified water is depleted of all the natural minerals nature intended for us to have in our water. Lastly, purified water usually tests acidic on the pH scale."

WaterTree water is also antioxidant water due to the fact their water has a negative oxidation-reduction potential reading (ORP).

"Antioxidant-rich water keeps your body healthy by lowering inflammation through fighting free radicals and toxins so the body may heal naturally," Mujtabaa said. "Aside from this, we have specialty bottled water that is very hard to locate anywhere, such as magnesium water, ionic calcium water, mineral force water, hemp water, rainwater, baby water and pet water. "

Mujtabaa said customers report experiencing more energy, better digestion, a boost in metabolism, glowing skin that is radiant and supple, better sleep and less inflammation.

Customers can purchase bottled water in-store or have 3- or 5-gallon jugs delivered.

"We also provide filtration systems that give you clean alkaline water at your sink and shower filtration systems that remove contaminants and sediments from your pipes while simultaneously emitting negative ions and aromatherapy," Mujtabaa said. "Our whole house filtration systems provide clean, filtered soft water throughout your home without using salt or electricity. Our systems do not produce water that kills plants. Our water is safe for pets to drink, and no salt is involved in your maintenance."

Many customers start off refilling water and then switch to home systems. Others switch from their salt systems to the home filtration systems.

Mujtabaa urges people to visit EWG.ORG to learn more about water. She also wants them to know that WaterTree Riverstone is not just an alkaline antioxidant water and health store. She is here for the community, participating in local Fort Bend County events.

"Through these events, we are meeting more people in the community," Mujtabaa said. "Often times people come by to talk, which

can make a world of difference for some people. We may never know our neighbors' challenges, whether health-related or personal. Either way, we are always a friendly face and take the time to know all of our customers turned friends."

Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight

When Stacy Bourgeois literally gave someone the shoes off her feet, it changed her life. She is the founder and CEO of Sole Loved, a non-profit organization that brings hope and joy to children one pair of shoes at a time.

Sole Loved began on the streets of Houston where Bourgeois was helping the homeless. She noticed that many in the homeless population were either barefoot, walking around in slides or flip flops, or wearing shoes that are completely falling apart. Many were just wearing layers of socks.



"The night I realized that this was something that I had to continue doing was the night I gave the shoes off my feet to a teen girl," Bourgeois said. "She was homeless, barefoot had absolutely nothing but the clothes she was wearing, and a tiny backpack to carry all her belongings. It broke my heart."

That night paved the way for Stacy to help not only the homeless but low income children. She founded Sole Loved in 2017. Not long after, she began getting calls and emails from school counselors who had seen the organization's Facebook posts.

Since then, the Sole Loved has partnered with 62 local, Title 1 and low-income schools, working directly with school social workers to bring shoes to thousands of children in need. This year alone, Soled Loved has provided more than 3,000 low-income children with brand-new socks and shoes.


Bourgeois said she gets at least one to three phone calls or emails per week from new schools asking if Sole Loved can provide shoes for their students.

"Shoes are expensive, especially for parents who are trying to decide between feeding their families and paying the bills," she said. "Shoes just aren't a priority for those families, and that's where we come in. If we can relieve that financial burden off a family in need, or in crisis, then we are doing something good."

According to Bourgeois, children need shoes for school that fit and are appropriate. New shoes help to improve self-esteem. They can run and play without foot pain from wearing shoes that are worn out or the wrong size.

"Ultimately, children just want to fit in and be like their peers," she said. "They don't want to stand out for all the wrong reasons or get bullied because they have duct tape holding their shoes together. New shoes bring acceptance, pride, excitement, happiness, hope,





love and pure joy. The second they slip their feet into the new shoes they've picked out they begin dancing, jumping, laughing and running! It absolutely fills my heart to see them so happy and so appreciative."

Sole Loved accepts new and very gently used tennis shoes, cleats, Converse, Vans and any other athletic or sports shoes that are appropriate for PE class. New shoes are preferred. They do not accept flipflops, house slippers, boots or heels. Shoes for adults are welcome. Monetary donations are also accepted.

Donated shoes are housed in a storage facility. They are inspected for major flaws then cleaned and distributed to those in need.

Bourgeois said none of this would be possible without a cadre of volunteers who host shoe and sock drives, sort shoes and deliver them to schools and organizations. They also help at events such as Sole Loved's summer back-to-school events.

"This is our passion," she said. "Sole Loved is 100 percent volunteer driven, meaning that 100 percent of the monetary donations

received go right back into the charity to provide shoes to every single child that needs a pair. Together, we are making a difference."

We will be collecting shoes during the Riverstone Wicked Fun Run, 8–11 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 22. All proceeds



from the event will benefit Sole Loved. You can learn about them donate or sign up to volunteer at https://soleloved.org.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an
 adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball
 when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.


SUMMER WATER FITNESS




















