- 3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.
- 4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.
- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

Getting Along With Your Gates

The Riverstone community is comprised of both gated and non-gated neighborhoods, with approximately 3000 occupied homes located in one of the access-controlled (gated) neighborhoods. The 28 operational gates that serve these neighborhoods are made up of many different moving parts and technology. For example, a toll tag reader is positioned at the entrance to the neighborhood and allows the gate to 'read' and respond to toll tags. Internet and phone lines allow for entry with unique 4-digit codes, as well as the ability to dial phone numbers and respond to number pad tones. The operator is the 'motherboard' of the gate and is comprised of a gearbox, motor, and control board. Other gate components include tracks and rollers (slide gates) or hinges and arms (swing gates). As you can see, there are many different elements that come into play to physically open and close a gate!

With so many different components, it is necessary to regularly check the operation of the gates to ensure they are functioning properly. While Riverstone HOA schedules regular, preventative maintenance inspections (PMIs) to help keep the gates running smoothly, sometimes mechanical and/or technical issues arise which are undetectable in a PMI. Some mechanical and technical issues are quick fixes—e.g. gate operators just need to be reset, an 'override' code just needs to be entered for a toll tag. Other times an inspection, diagnosis, and finally repair by a 3rd party gate contractor may be necessary to get the gate functioning again. The severity of the problem, the availability of part(s), and the schedules of contractors can all play a role in the time it takes for a gate to once again be operational.

While Riverstone HOA staff members regularly drive through gates to make sure they are functioning properly, don't hesitate to report gate issues to us. The easiest way to do this is by reporting the problem

on the LUKE app. (Please refer to the inside front cover for more information on LUKE.) Residents may also report gate issues by emailing the Operations Team at operations@riverstone.com or by calling the HOA office at 281.778.2222.

To improve communication, Riverstone HOA has started sending out emails to residents within a gated neighborhood when it becomes necessary for their gate to be left open for more than a few days. If you wish to be added to the gate distribution list, please email operations@riverstone.com.

TIPS TO HELP YOU 'GET ALONG WITH YOUR GATE':

- Visit the HOA office to set up toll tag information, create a 4-digit code, and provide name/phone number to be listed in your gate's directory.
- Do not share your 4-digit code with others. Have guests locate your name in the directory and have the gate call the number you provided. You can then open the gate by pressing '9' from that phone.
- Throwing a party? Contact the HOA office for a temporary code to allow guests entry.
- When entering the neighborhood, drive close to the toll tag reader. Please contact the HOA office if you do not know where the reader is located for your gate.
- Do NOT "bump" the gates to try to get them to open. This will damage the gates and prevent them from functioning properly.
- Do NOT enter through the exit gate, or exit through the entry gate. Again, this can impede the gate's ability to function properly.
- Leave all rodent traps in place around gate entrances. Rodents chew through phone and internet lines impairing their ability to send/receive information.
- Construction can also damage the lines. Make certain to locate lines before digging.
- Report misconduct at gates immediately! Please provide as much information as possible including the date, time, and license plate information if available.
- Finally, remember that the gates are access-control gates and do not replace security measures that residents should take to in regards to protecting their property.

Why Topping Hurts Trees

Now that spring is here; you'll likely spend more time outside and may begin to consider pruning your trees. Please take care to properly crop branches to avoid over-trimming or topping your trees.

Topping is the indiscriminate cutting of branches back to stubs or lateral branches that are not large enough to sustain the remaining branch. This pruning method is often used to reduce the size of a tree. A homeowner may feel that their tree has become too large for their property or that tall trees may pose an unacceptable risk. Topping, however, is not a viable method of height reduction and certainly does not reduce future risk. Additionally, this practice is not approved by the Riverstone Home Owners Association and is considered a compliance violation.

Factors to Consider

Stresses Trees

Topping can remove 50 to 100 percent of a tree's leaf-bearing crown. Leaves are the food factories of a tree. Removing them can temporarily starve a tree and trigger various survival mechanisms.

Leads to Decay

Correct pruning cuts are made just beyond the branch collar at the point of attachment. The tree is biologically equipped to close such a wound, provided the tree is healthy enough, and the wound is not too

large. However, cuts made along a limb between lateral branches create stubs with wounds that the tree may be unable to close. Causing the exposed wood tissues to begin to decay.

Can Lead to Sunburn

Branches within a tree's crown produce thousands of leaves to absorb sunlight. When the leaves are removed, the remaining branches and trunk are suddenly exposed to high levels of light and heat. The result may be sunburn of the tissues beneath the bark, which can lead to cankers, bark splitting, and death of some branches.

Makes Trees Ugly

The natural branching structure of a tree is a biological wonder. Topping removes the ends of the branches, often leaving ugly stubs. Topping destroys the natural form of a tree.



It's Expensive

Topping can lead to increased maintenance costs, Reduced property value, and increased liability potential.

Alternatives to Topping

Sometimes a tree's height or spread needs to be reduced, such as to provide utility line clearance. There are recommended techniques for doing so. Small branches should be removed back to their point of origin. If a larger limb must be shortened, it should be pruned back to a lateral branch that is large enough (at least one-third the diameter of the limb being removed) to assume the terminal role. This method of branch reduction helps to preserve the natural form of the tree. However, if significant cuts are involved, the tree may be unable to close over and compartmentalize the wounds.

Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight



According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), autism is the fastest growing developmental disability in the United States, affecting 1 in 44 children. More than 6,300 children diagnosed on the autism spectrum are enrolled in Fort Bend County public schools. Hope For Three raises awareness and provides support for the families of these children.

Founded in 2011, Hope For Three is one of the only nonprofits in the Greater Houston area to focus solely on autism and the only nonprofit in the Fort Bend County area that provides assistance on an ongoing basis. Their mission according to Darla Farmer, CEO for Hope For Three, is to increase empathy, understanding, acceptance and inclusion.

"The FARS program provides quality resources and referrals to anyone, regardless of location," Farmer said. "The financial component of the program provides financial aid to qualified Fort Bend County residents.



Last year, we awarded over \$217,500 to 106 autistic children, directly impacting about 425 family members. "

Hope For Three also provided resources, referrals and support to

more than 250 inquiring parties, as well as training 330 members of law enforcement on the characteristics of autism and engagement strategies.

Many volunteers contribute their time and talent to the organization, including teens. They can participate in two programs, Sibling Sessions and Caregivers Time Out.

"Sibling Sessions provide one-on-one opportunities for a teen huddle member to serve as a mentor to a sibling of an autistic individual through a host of activities," Farmer

"Many of our caregivers, parents and autistic loved ones struggle with social disapproval, exclusion, stereotyping and judgment," Farmer said. "Hope For Three can advance change through outreach, education and awareness."

The nonprofit offers a range of programs to help local families, including financial aid, training, support groups, community outreach and more.

What many people don't know about autism is the financial toll it can take, Farmer said. The annual cost of care for one child with autism is about \$60,000. The lifetime cost of care is estimated to extend up to \$2.4 million. That's where the organization's most popular program, the Family Assistance and Resource Support (FARS), comes in.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an
 adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball
 when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.
