- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

Lawn Care

As fall approaches, many residents will likely be outdoors more often. The change of seasons is the perfect opportunity to pause and assess any necessary lawn maintenance.

About Our Community Crepe Myrtles

Riverstone residents have likely noticed the dead crape myrtles within the community. While the HOA is currently addressing this, we thought you might be interested in the triple climate punch that caused this. We reached out to well-known local landscape architect Clark Condon for an explanation. Here's what they had to say:

Plants in the region have been experiencing extreme stress due to three significant climate events: Winter Storm Uri in February 2021, the unprecedented heat wave and 10-week drought of the 2022 summer, and Winter Storm Elliott in December 2022. Local horticulturists are still assessing the full extent of the impacts, but initial findings on woody ornamentals have been





reported by Dr. David Creech, Director of the Stephen F. Austin State University Gardens, in a recent article in the Texas Gardener.

He notes woody ornamentals that nearly perished in the aftermath of Uri unexpectedly "returned vigorously from the base." However, less than a year after this unprecedented weather event, Winter Storm Elliott left these same ornamentals "unprepared" and unable to recover. Dr. Creech also reports that "the freeze impacts are

showing a delayed response," with older plants appearing to suffer less than the younger plant material. As seen in the landscapes around Riverstone, there have been a few species where this decline has been particularly noticeable, including the crape myrtles. At the Stephen F. Austin University Gardens, they are currently assessing 136 varieties of crape myrtles. In general, there was "good survival, but some varieties are showing dieback and unthrifty growth."

Winter Storm Elliott devastated local plants, as the sudden combination of plummeting temperatures, dry air, and powerful winds left little chance for acclimation to the freezing weather conditions. Although colder in temperature, Winter Storm Uri brought frozen precipitation that encased trees, insulating them from the freezing temperatures. Within Riverstone, the impacts of these weather events can be seen as many crape myrtles have died or are showing signs of stress. Observing the effects of the storm, it is evident that crape myrtle health varies within the community. This inconsistency can be attributed to factors like microclimates and plant age.

Furthermore, the long-term impacts of these environmental stresses are still under observation. For example, the harsh freezing winds caused destructive cracks in the branches and trunks of trees, leaving them vulnerable to infestations by pests and insects. Consequently, the burden placed on these trees has continued their slow decline.

Fort Bend County Nonprofit Spotlight

Nestled in the heart of Fort Bend County is a truly exceptional place called The Brookwood Community, a God-centered non-profit residential and vocational community for adults with functional disabilities.

Founded in 1985 by Yvonne Tuttle Streit, The Brookwood Community helps their "Citizens" acquire meaningful job skills and experience the pride that accompanies the ability to contribute to one's own support, as well as growing professionally, socially emotionally and spiritually.

"Most young people with functional disabilities think graduation from school is a 'magic' day," said Streit, Founder and Executive Director Emeritus for The Brookwood Community. "They tend to think this because they have studied and worked hard and the diploma they earned is their key to success. But after graduation, there are not many places adults with functional disabilities may work. It is a very sad situation."



Currently, 112 Citizens live and work on the 485-acre campus in Brookshire. Another 94 live at home and attend a day program. Twenty-nine attend day programs at satellite campuses in The Woodlands Richmond. campuses serve adults with autism spectrum disorders.

intellectual disabilities, developmental disabilities, traumatic brain injuries, dual diagnosis and/or aging care needs.

The Brookwood Community provides a wide range of vocational opportunities tailored to the unique abilities and interests of its residents. From horticulture and woodworking to pottery and culinary arts, residents can explore and develop their talents in a supportive and encouraging environment. The Brookwood Community does not accept government funding.

"Our funding comes from tuition, enterprise revenue and donations," Shara Pullen, Marketing and Communication Manager said. "We are committed to serving adults with disabilities from all economic backgrounds and give extensive scholarship assistance."

"Many families need and receive more than \$1 million in tuition aid," Streit said. "Private sector donations include individuals, corporations, foundations, churches and civic groups. Brookwood's budget is 40 percent tuition, 40 percent enterprise revenue, and 20 percent donations."

Brookwood Community provides a safe and nurturing home environment boasting picturesque gardens, lakes and charming

cottages. In addition to comfortable residential accommodations, the community offers amenities such as a chapel, a café, an art gallery, a gift shop and a garden center.

Contributing to that atmosphere are Citizen Home Supervisors and Direct Support Professionals who encourage interdependence between all who live in the home.

"Our homes foster a wholesome living environment that allows each person to live interdependently with one another and all become

contributing members in their home," Pullen, said.

There are a number of ways people can contribute to the success of Brookwood Community, including shopping at the The Brookwood Café and Gift & Garden Center. The café was voted one of the



best around on OpenTable and received the coveted "Diner's Choice 2023" in several categories. Both The Brookwood Café and chapel are available for weddings, events, and catering. Volunteers are always needed and welcome.

Pullen suggests that people come out to see The Brookwood Community for themselves.

"If you've never been to t/he Brookwood Community, come take a tour," she said. "Come and see for yourself how the Citizens at Brookwood are changing the way the world thinks about adults with disabilities."


