MANAGING ROSE ROSETTE DISEASE IN OUR COMMUNITY



The HOA has recently contracted a professional landscape service to address the spread of Rose Rosette Disease (RRD) throughout several areas in our community. This step was necessary due to the aggressive nature of the disease and our commitment to maintaining healthy, attractive landscaping.

What Is Rose Rosette Disease?

Rose Rosette Disease is a virus that affects roses, particularly the commonly used Knock Out variety. It is spread by a tiny, wingless mite and can also be transmitted through grafting or pruning with infected tools. Infected plants show symptoms such as:

- Unusually rapid growth
- Deformed or overly red leaves
- Excessive thorniness
- Witches' broom (a tangled, clustered appearance of new shoots)
- Decline and eventual death of the plant

How Does It Spread?

While RRD is typically spread by mites or contaminated tools, it's important to note that the disease may have been unintentionally introduced or spread by anyone passing through the area—including pedestrians, maintenance crews, or contractors—from contact with infected plants or landscapes. Wind can also carry the mites

from one area to another. Because of this, it's nearly impossible to identify a single source or assign blame. The HOA's current focus is on timely and effective management to limit further spread and minimize long-term impact.

Is It Treatable?

Unfortunately, there is no known cure or treatment for Rose Rosette Disease. Once a rose bush is infected, it cannot recover. Pruning affected parts is not effective, as the virus spreads throughout the plant systemically.

How Is It Managed?

To prevent further spread and protect healthy plantings nearby, the only reliable solution is full removal of the infected rose plants, including the roots. The landscaper has begun systematically removing affected roses across the community. This proactive approach is essential to controlling the disease.

What Residents Can Expect

As a result of the removals, some landscape beds may appear bare or sparse for a time. We understand this may affect the visual appeal of those areas, but rest assured, this is a temporary situation. The HOA is currently evaluating next steps to determine the best course of action for replanting or redesigning the affected beds with more disease-resistant or diverse plant selections.

How You Can Help

If you notice similar symptoms in rose bushes on your private property, we encourage you to consult a landscape professional. Prompt removal helps protect the broader community's landscape from further infection.

We appreciate your understanding and support as we take necessary steps to protect and preserve the beauty of Riverstone.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS TIPS FROM THE HOA

As hurricane season approaches, it's a good idea to take some steps to prepare yourself and your property. Here are a few tips to help you get ready:

Generators

If you are considering adding a standby generator to your home, be sure to submit a modification application. This does not apply to portable generators.

Fence & Roof Repairs

If your fence is damaged during a hurricane, you can replace it using the same materials without prior approval from the HOA. This allows for quicker repairs and helps restore your property promptly. Similarly, necessary roof repairs can be made with the same materials, and no approval is required.

Secure Your Trash Bins

To prevent debris and litter from scattering, make sure to bring your trash bins inside or secure them in a sheltered area during storms.

Remove Dead Trees or Tree Branches

Removing any dead tree branches or trees will help to reduce potential damage to your property during high winds from a storm.

Anchor Trampolines

If you have a trampoline, it's crucial to anchor it down. Strong winds can easily lift unanchored trampolines, turning them into dangerous projectiles.

Taking these steps can help mitigate the risks associated with hurricanes and help keep you and your property prepared!

Keep Our Community Clean: Store Trash Cans and Bags Out of Sight on Non-Trash Days

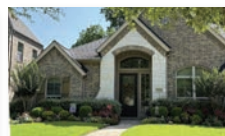

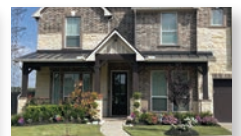

FORT BEND COUNTY NON-PROFIT SPOTLIGHT

BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF FORT BEND

With a mission rooted in building confidence, improving academic outcomes and nurturing brighter futures, Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) of Fort Bend is a beacon of hope for families in Fort Bend County.



Big Brothers Big Sisters of Fort Bend is a regional branch of BBBS Greater Houston, providing one-to-one mentoring for youth in Fort Bend County.

"Big Brothers Big Sisters programs help children build confidence, improve academic and social skills and expand their vision for the future through one-to-one mentorship," said Diana Turner, Fort Bend Area Manager for Big Brothers Big Sisters Greater Houston. "These supportive relationships help Littles feel seen, supported and empowered to reach their full potential."

Big Brothers Big Sisters serves youth aged 6 to 18. While many programs focus on children between 6 and 14, older teens are also supported.

The three main programs offered are Community-based Mentoring, Site-based Mentoring and Mentor 2.0. Community-based Mentoring is where "Bigs" and "Littles" meet two to four times per month in the community. Site-based Mentoring is where matched Bigs and Littles meet at schools or partner sites during the day. Mentor 2.0 is a college and career readiness program for high school students that combines in-person and virtual mentoring.

In the Mentor 2.0 program, mentors and mentees meet weekly, combining virtual and in-person interactions to guide teens through college and career readiness.

"Teens in our mentorship programs gain confidence, life skills and a clearer path to success," Turner said. "Statistically, 98 percent of Littles who take part in our programs are either enlisted in the military, enrolled in college or trade school or employed after high school—showing just how impactful having a mentor can be."

One inspiring story is that of Re'Nah and her Big Sister, Shelby. Their journey began in 2015 when Re'Nah was just eight years old. Over the years, Shelby provided guidance, encouragement and exposure to new opportunities, helping Re'Nah expand her horizons and dream bigger. From exploring new environments to navigating challenges, Shelby was a constant source of support. This mentorship culminated in a proud moment in 2023 when Re'Nah landed an internship with KPMG, reflecting her growth, ambition and determi-



nation. The bond between Re'Nah and Shelby even extended to their families, demonstrating how one mentorship relationship can have a profound, lasting impact.

Becoming a Big Brother or Big Sister with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Fort Bend is a straightforward and rewarding process that includes an application, background checks, reference checks and an in-depth interview.

"Volunteers also complete training to prepare them for the role," Turner said. "Once approved, they're matched with a Little based on shared interests and personality. From there, BBBS staff provide ongoing support to help the match grow and succeed. The goal is to create safe, lasting relationships that make a meaningful impact."

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Houston, which oversees BBBS Fort Bend, has served 1,456 kids this year and expects to reach more than 2,000 volunteers by the end of the year. Despite this progress, more than 800 children, including those in the Fort Bend area, are still waiting to be matched with a mentor.

"By becoming a mentor, you can make a lasting impact on a child's life," Turner said. "With over 800 kids in the area waiting for a mentor, your support can truly change the course of their future. Just a few hours a month can make all the difference."

Beyond volunteering, people can support BBBS with financial donations that help the organization recruit and train mentors, provide

background checks and fund enriching activities for the kids. People can also get involved by attending or sponsoring events, joining the Young Professionals Group or supporting creative initiatives that raise awareness for the cause.

"Every contribution—whether through time, money or resources—helps provide more children with the opportunity to benefit from mentorship and reach their full potential," Turner said.

To become a volunteer, you must be at least 18 years old and commit to spending a minimum of four hours per month with your Little. This includes a commitment of at least one year, ensuring consistency and stability for the child.

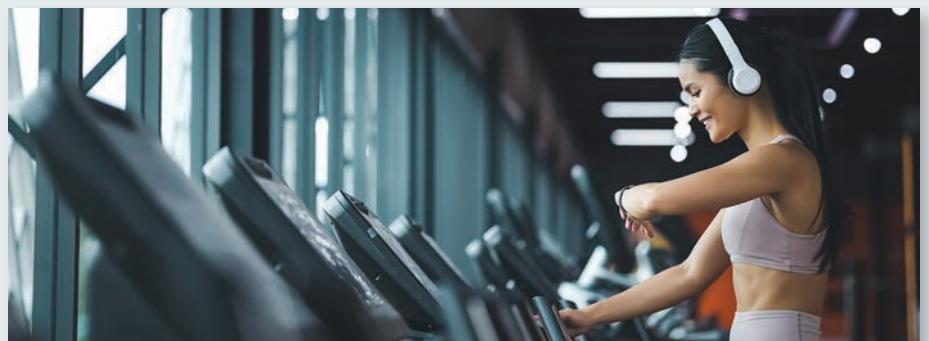

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.
- Remember that court reservations will be forfeited after 15 minutes of not showing up for scheduled start time.

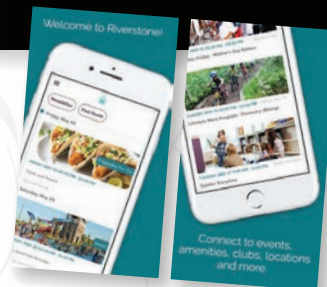
