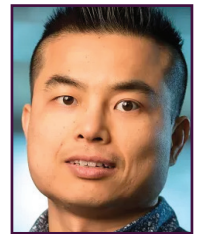

Who Do I Call?

UNDERSTANDING HOA, MUD, LID, CITY & COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES IN RIVERSTONE

One of the most common questions we hear from residents is, "Who do I call about that?" Whether you're dealing with a water outage, a streetlight that's out, drainage concerns, questions about the pools, or even an alligator sighting, knowing which organization is responsible can help get your issue resolved more quickly.

In Riverstone, several organizations work together to keep our community running smoothly. While each has a different role, they all share the same goal of maintaining the high quality of life our residents enjoy. Here's a breakdown of who does what.

THE RIVERSTONE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION (HOA)

Funded through homeowner assessments, the Riverstone Homeowners Association plays a vital role in maintaining the amenities, services, and community standards that make Riverstone a premier place to live.

The HOA is responsible for:

- Pools and recreation centers
- Tennis and pickleball courts
- Parks and playgrounds
- Community events and programs
- HOA-maintained common area landscaping
- Modification Sub-Committee (MSC) applications and architectural modifications
- Deed restriction enforcement
- Amenity access cards
- Gated neighborhood access systems
- HOA-owned streetlights (identified by a two- or three-digit pole number)

If your question involves community amenities, landscaping, architectural modifications, deed restrictions, resident services, gated access, or HOA-owned streetlights, the HOA is your first point of contact.

MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICTS (MUDS)

Riverstone is served by four Municipal Utility Districts (MUDs): Fort Bend County MUD Nos. 115, 128, 129, and 149.

The MUDs provide and maintain the essential utility infrastructure that keeps our community operating every day.

The MUDs are responsible for:

- Water service
- Sewer service
- Water and wastewater infrastructure
- Mosquito abatement
- Supplemental neighborhood law enforcement services

Contact your MUD if you experience a water outage, water leak, sewer issue, or have questions about mosquito spraying or MUD-sponsored patrol services.

LEEVE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS (LIDS)

Riverstone is protected by an extensive levee system maintained by Fort Bend County LID Nos. 15 and 19.

The LIDs help protect Riverstone from flooding while maintaining critical flood-control infrastructure.

The LIDs are responsible for:

- Levee maintenance and operations
- Pump stations
- Flood protection infrastructure
- Stormwater management associated with the levee system
- Wildlife management of waterways in partnership with Texas Parks and Wildlife

Contact your LID regarding flood protection concerns, levee operations, pump stations, or alligator and other wildlife concerns within LID-managed waterways.

CITY OF MISSOURI CITY

The City of Missouri City maintains public infrastructure within the portions of Riverstone located inside the city limits.

Missouri City is responsible for:

- Public streets and roadway maintenance
- Street signs

- Traffic signals
- Drainage within city rights-of-way

FORT BEND COUNTY

Fort Bend County provides a variety of services throughout Riverstone.

The County is responsible for:

- Law enforcement through the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office and Constables
- County roads and bridges
- County traffic infrastructure

- Utility easement permitting

WORKING TOGETHER FOR RIVERSTONE

Understanding who is responsible for different services helps ensure your questions are directed to the right organization and resolved as quickly as possible.

RIVERSTONE FAQ

Who Do I Call?

1. Q: My water is off. Who do I call?

A: Contact your Municipal Utility District (MUD). Your MUD is responsible for water service, water distribution, and related utility infrastructure.

2. Q: The power is out in my neighborhood. Who do I contact?

A: Report the outage to CenterPoint Energy.

3. Q: The streetlight in front of my home is out. Who do I call?

A: If the pole has a two- or three-digit identification number, contact the Riverstone HOA. Otherwise, contact CenterPoint Energy and report that the streetlight is not functioning.

4. Q: A traffic signal isn't working. Who should I call?

A: Contact the City of Missouri City.

5. Q: I found a loose or stray dog. Who should I call?

A: Contact Fort Bend County Animal Services. If the animal is creating an immediate safety hazard, call 911.

6. Q: I'm concerned about an alligator near my home or in one of the lakes. Who should I contact?

A: Contact your Levee Improvement District (LID). The LIDs work with Texas Parks and Wildlife to manage alligators and other wildlife within Riverstone.

7. Q: Mosquitoes are becoming a problem in my neighborhood. Who do I contact?

A: Contact your MUD, which oversees mosquito abatement and spraying programs.

8. Q: My amenity access card isn't working. Who do I call?

A: Contact Riverstone HOA.

9. Q: I want to build a fence, replace my roof, install a pool, or make exterior changes to my home. Who do I contact?

A: Contact the Riverstone HOA to submit a Modification Sub-Committee (MSC) application before beginning work.

10. Q: I see suspicious activity in my neighborhood. Who should I call?

A: For emergencies or crimes in progress, call 911. For non-emergency law enforcement concerns, contact the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office.

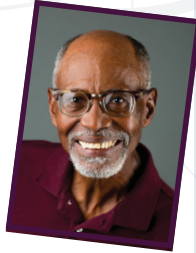

- Summer Tennis runs from June 1st through August 1st.
- Summer Session 2 runs from July 6th through August 1st
- Make-up week is August 3rd through August 5th.
- All registrations are done through the Riverstone app.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Unauthorized Tennis Lessons

There has been tennis lessons at Riverstone by unauthorized tennis pros. Please keep in mind that HOA rules prohibits the teaching of tennis lessons by unauthorized persons.

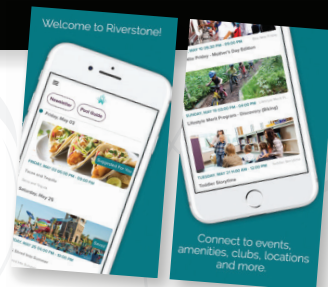
