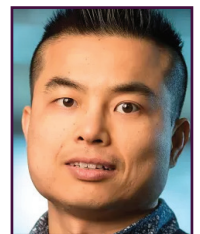

RIVERSTONE HOA BOARD OF DIRECTORS *Call for Candidates*

The Riverstone Homeowners Association, Inc. is currently seeking individuals interested in running for the 2027 Board of Directors. Below is a list of frequently asked questions regarding the Board and the election process:

Why is there an election for the Board?

As stated in the community guidelines, elected Directors serve staggered terms based on the number of votes they receive. Jay Parekh and Zeena Ashraf were assigned 2-year terms based on the results of the 2025 election. As a result, these two seats are open for candidate nominations for the 2027 Board of Directors.

What are the responsibilities of the Board?

The primary role of the Board, with support from HOA staff, is to oversee the business of the association and plan for the future. This includes approving annual budgets, developing policies, adopting resolutions, awarding contracts for services, approving capital expenditures, hearing homeowners' appeals on deed restriction violation issues, making decisions on collection and legal matters, and guiding our staff. Board members are entrusted to make significant decisions that affect the community's well-being.

Do I have time for this?

As a Board member, you will need to dedicate a minimum of 10-12 hours per month to the Association (possibly more if you serve as an officer).

Are Board members compensated?

No. Serving on the Riverstone HOA Board of Directors is a volunteer position, and Board members are not compensated for their service.

Who serves on the Board?

The Riverstone HOA Board positions are held by Riverstone HOA members in good standing.

How long is a Board member's term?

Elected Board members will serve staggered terms. The positions open for election will serve a 3-year term beginning January 2027.

How are winners determined?

A quorum of 10% of eligible members is required. Once this quorum is reached, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes will serve 3-year terms.

Who tabulates the votes?

A third-party company will handle the voting process and tabulate the results to ensure the integrity of the election. Neither the Riverstone HOA Board nor Management will be involved in verifying or tallying the votes.

If you are interested in serving on the Board, please complete the Willingness to Serve Form and return it, along with a photograph, to Ryan Evans via email at customercare@riverstone.com or by hand delivery to the Association Office at 18353 University Blvd. by 5pm on October 2nd, 2026. Nomination forms will not be accepted after this time. PDF copies of the Candidate Willingness to Serve Form, along with additional information and photos, will be available online at www.riverstone.com.

Voting Timeline

Voting will begin on October 16th and will close on November 16th at 5pm. The results will be announced on December 8th during the Annual Meeting of Members.

BEHIND THE GATES

What It Takes to Keep Riverstone Moving

Every day, thousands of Riverstone residents drive through one of our community's gated entrances without giving it a second thought. You pull up, the gate opens, and you're on your way.

But have you ever wondered what actually happens behind the scenes?

With 29 gated entrances serving approximately 3,000 homes, keeping Riverstone's gates operating reliably takes much more than simply fixing a broken gate. Each time a gate opens, several systems work together in a matter of seconds to verify access, communicate with the system, check safety devices, and activate the gate.



It's More Than Just a Gate

A community gate may look simple, but several interconnected systems must work together for it to operate properly.

The Access System acts as the gate's "brain." It stores resident information, recognizes registered EZ Tags and access credentials, manages entry codes, communicates with callboxes, and records gate activity.

The Communication Network connects gates through internet and telephone service and, in some locations, cellular service. Weather, utility outages, construction damage, or service disruptions can interrupt these connections and affect gate operation.

The Electronic Hardware includes toll tag readers, keypads, callboxes, access card readers, safety sensors, vehicle detection loops, and control boards that help coordinate gate operation.

The Mechanical Equipment does the heavy lifting. Motors, gearboxes, tracks, rollers, hinges, and swing arms physically move and guide the gates.

A problem with just one component can affect the entire system.

So What Happens When Something Goes Wrong?

When a gate issue is reported, the first step isn't necessarily sending a contractor—it's determining what's actually causing the problem.

The Riverstone Operations Team first determines whether the issue involves resident programming, power, communications, electronic hardware, safety devices, or a mechanical component. Many programming or communication issues can be resolved remotely or by HOA staff.

When additional repairs are needed, Gated Neighborhood Technicians perform on-site diagnostics and determine the appropriate repair. This may involve replacing hardware, repairing communication equipment, adjusting mechanical components, or coordinating with specialized contractors or utility providers.

Finding the root cause is often the most important part of making a lasting repair.

Keeping an Eye on the Gates

The Operations Team also performs regular inspections of Riverstone's gated neighborhoods, checking gate movement and alignment, safety devices, readers, callboxes, and overall system performance.

Preventive maintenance helps identify potential problems early, but not every issue is visible. Problems inside an operator, control board, or communication network may not become apparent until a malfunction occurs.

Why Some Repairs Take Longer

One question we hear often is, "Why isn't the gate fixed yet?"

Some repairs can be completed the same day. Others may require specialized parts, warranty approval, utility-provider assistance, certified technicians, or coordination among multiple vendors.

Priority also matters. Issues that prevent residents from entering or exiting their neighborhood are considered high priority and receive immediate attention whenever possible.

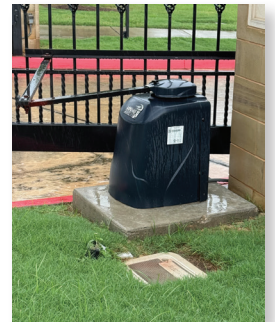
How Residents Can Help

Residents also play an important role in keeping these systems working properly:

- Keep your EZ Tag and resident information current with the HOA.
- Never force or "bump" a gate open.
- Use designated entry and exit lanes correctly.
- Keep children from climbing or hanging on gates.
- Report gate issues promptly through the LUKE app or by contacting the HOA Office.

Early reporting can help the Operations Team investigate an issue before it develops into a larger repair.

The next time you pull into your neighborhood and the gate opens, remember there's much more happening than meets the eye. From access control and communications to electronic hardware and mechanical equipment, multiple systems work together "behind the gates" every day to help keep Riverstone moving.

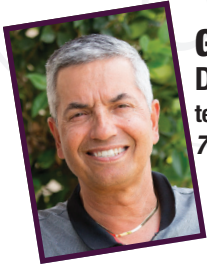

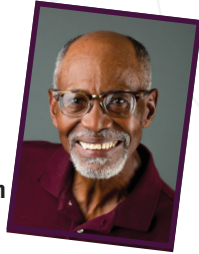

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis or pickleball courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

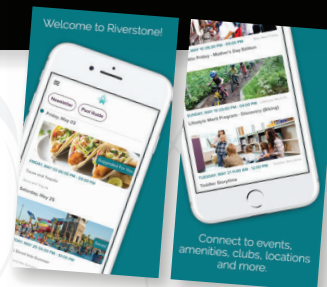
